



Bringing Our Neighborhood Together



Information: Update block's information (phone lists, neighborhood map) that your neighbors voluntarily provide (this information is only shared with with the residents on my blocks-this map/list is invaluable for contacting your neighbors when there is an emergency, suspicious activity, a garage left open, a dog that escaped, etc). Keep the block map current, with names, addresses and phone numbers of people on the block and get it out to neighbors. Welcome new neighbors and give them the information about the neighborhood. Organize block meetings to share information and promote neighbors getting to know one another so we can look out for one another. Provide contact information for resources to assist neighbors who have problems with crime, community, neighbors, and personal welfare situations.

Neighborhood Watch/Crime Prevention: Coordinate Neighborhood Watch (A neighborhood watch program brings together law enforcement, city officials and neighbors in an effort to work together to provide protection for their homes and neighborhood). Pass on information provided by the police department and residents to neighbors when crimes occur or there is suspicious activity. Supply information on various topics such as: gangs, fraud and scams, gun safety, graffiti, vandalism, crime prevention and home security. Organize National Night Out (this is a nationwide night for neighbors to come together and let criminals know they will NOT tolerate crime in their neighborhood-a "block party").

Community/Neighborhood: Share information on programs, meetings, events.



Etcetera, Etcetera, Etcetera: Coordinate and communicate and assist with anything else that Tait Danielson, our Frogtown Community Liaison, wishes me to do with my area.

We moved here in August of 2009. I have met many of you and thank those that were so kind to us when we arrived. I look forward to meeting the rest of you and seeing you all at our National Night Out block party! Please feel free to contact me. I have included a neighborhood map and will be compiling the resident list with names and phone numbers.



Resident Alert

PROSTITUTION-We still have a few prostitutes left hanging around the corners of Galtier/Sherburne & Uni along with Farrington/Sherburne & Uni. If you see someone exhibiting the signs of prostituting (hailing down vehicles, approaching vehicles, getting in vehicles and returning shortly after, etc) call 911. Give them a description of the person, if you can get plate numbers of the cars of the johns-great. Also let 911 know where they are hanging around. With a joint effort, this problem can be eradicated from this area. Many have been driven out already. Prostitution is illegal and most often brings violence and drugs along with it.

CAR THEFT SUSPECT-An Asian male, medium to thin build, late teens to early 20's, with short hair, has been spotted in the area late at night trying the door handles on cars. He was also seen looking in the back of trucks and in boats. Keep your vehicle doors locked and nothing valuable within. If you see this individual in action, call 911 immediately.

THE WHISTLER-On multiple occasions, a male has been spotted on the corner of Galtier and University who appears out of the shadows when he hears a whistle, and he himself whistles and hooks up with a person. He has also been heard near the area of Farrington and University. If you see and/or hear this situation, call 911 immediately and report suspicious activity.

GARAGE BURGLARIES-We have had quite a few garage burglaries in the alley between Charles and Sherburne earlier this summer. Make sure your garages are locked, windows covered so you can't see in, and well lit outside. Don't leave valuables in your car even if it is in your garage, and always lock it when it is in the garage. The alley is terribly dark. If you happen to see suspicious activity in the alley, call 911 right away. Be aware of who your neighbors are so you know who does and doesn't belong back there.

One Tenant Eviction Turns An Entire Block Around

Since the eviction of the tenants at 527 Galtier (the upper section of the duplex), that area has quieted down immensely. These tenants were dealing drugs, high on meth all night long & roaming the area, selling stolen goods and interacting with prostitues. We had drug traffic, damage to public property, sexual acts, urination on surrounding properties and much, much more. Unfortunately, it took many police calls and the swat team coming out before the landlord finally took action. Even then, we still had to wait 30+ more days of illegal chaos before all settled down. Per the St Paul police department, rental properties are the biggest source of crime in a neighborhood. Landlords really need to do background, criminal history and rental history checks on perspective tenants. Properties should be adequately maintained and tenants/and their guests kept in check. Surrounding residents should keep the landlord informed of any problems and call the police whenever necessary.



Frogtown Litter Patrol Cleaning Litter Up Block by Block

We seem to have quite a problem with litter. Between people over filling their trash cans and the wind blowing it all over the streets and neighbors yards, to recycling being whisked away with the breezes, and finally the people who are just too lazy to do anything but dump their trash as they walk or drive by.

Why worry about litter? Because it costs us. Millions of dollars are spent picking up litter each year. A community natural beauty is diminished by carelessly tossed out trash. Litter threatens health as trash piles become homes for insects and rodents. Litter in the street goes down our storm drains and flows out into the Mississippi.

The incidence of littering appears to be increasing and is becoming a growing concern due to its impact upon public health, safety, and community well being.

- Litter is defined as misplaced solid waste.
- Research has shown the most frequent litterer is male between the ages of 18 and 30.
- Studies show that people are more likely to litter if an area is already littered.
- Research dictates that people are more likely to litter on ill kept property
- Litter is detrimental to community efforts to attract visitors and prospective new businesses to their community.
- Litter is a precursor to graffiti and other community blights which are linked to gang activity, crime, and overall neighborhood decline.
- Cigarette butts make up most of the litter on our streets.
- Litter washes into our bodies of water and pollutes our water supply.

What can you do? The first, and most important, thing is to set a good example by not littering. Once you've committed to keeping your trash where it belongs, you can also work on the following:

- 1. Pick up one piece of litter every day.
- 2. If you haul materials in the back of a truck, be sure to cover your load. Much of the litter on our roadways is accidentally blown out of the back of trucks.
- 3. Make sure your trash cans have lids that can be securely attached. If you have curbside trash service, don't put out uncovered containers or open boxes filled with trash. Bungee cords work well to hold lids in place.
- 4. Secure papers before placing them in a curbside recycling bin. Loose papers can be blown out by the wind.
- 5. Carry a litterbag in your car. Try reusing your plastic grocery bags. They make great car litterbags.
- 6. If you are a smoker, use a proper ashtray or trash receptacle to dispose of your cigarettes at home and away.
- 7. Keep your own property up so that people are less likely to deposit their trash on it.

I would like to assemble a group of neighborhood children to meet together once a month. We would go around together and pick up trash in our neighborhood. I am working with local business, government, and other sources to find funding for trash bags, and trash grabbers. Also, I would like to make or get t-shirts or vests for us to wear when we are out on "Litter Patrol" and some sort of extra reward for the time and effort of the children. Anyone with resources and/or children (ages 7-12 years of age) who would like to participate, please let me know.

Alley Repair Section Between Farrington/Galtier, Sherburne & Charles

We have been having a problem with the alley where it dips down towards Galtier. Water pools deeply when it rains in two distinct areas, overflowing into resident driveways, garages and even to the foundation of one resident's home (flooding the basement). In addition, we have a problem with ice in the winter in this area. The city will be addressing and fixing this problem.

Vacant House and Lot Update

Corner lot on Galtier/Sherburne through 262 Sherburne Ave is still hanging in "limbo". The vacant 5 -plex (256-258) is on the list to be torn down. It will be gone within the next two weeks. The scuttlebutt was that the property was going to be turned into single family homes. The entire section was looked at by Presbyterian homes 6 months ago to purchase and build an elder care facility. We don't know where that stands. A developer was looking at that property and soil samples were taken.







Project Safe Haven

The Saint Paul Fire Department invites homeowners to take part in "Project Safe Haven". Those interested will receive a safety checklist and a short form to fill out when completed. When finished, contact the fire department (651-228-6273) and firefighters will make a courtesy visit to your home to make sure your smoke alarms work.


If needed, they will install a free smoke alarm and/or a digital carbon monoxide detector. You will receive a Safe Haven Certificate and a complimentary gift as a thank you. The program is FREE and open to Saint Paul owner-occupied single family homes including townhomes and condos.

This program is also wonderful for children. This is a great thing to do while they are home for the summer. This is a fun way to teach your children about fire and home safety. They can meet the firefighters that come out to the house. They can go out and see the fire truck. They also receive a firefighter's badge sticker and safety booklet. Call 651-228-6273 to set up your appointment.

Another fun thing to do is to go visit the firehouse at 681 University Ave, Station 18. Try to not go during meal times-we don't want to interupt their meal time. This is the fire department that is first to respond to our area. Built in 1910, this firehouse is loaded with history. Stop by and a firefighter will give you a grand tour. See the old ladders, the slide poles, the old trampoline that they would catch people who jumped out of windows in and so much more! You can even get your blood pressure checked for free while you are there. Do note, you are at the mercy of their calls for service. If they have to respond to a call during your tour, or are out when you arrive for a tour, be patient or return at another time.



EDMUND AVE





10:00pm to 4:00am Daily-no loitering or playing on or in public places UNACCOMPANIED MINORS AGES 15 to 17:

12:01am to 4:00am Daily-restricted from public areas daily

It is unlawful for parents, guardians or other adults having charge over a minor to allow or permit that minor to violate curfew.
