(insert Aquarius pic here) My great grandfather, Gilbert R. Ford, was born in Knox County, TN, in 1845. When the Civil War broke out, he joined Co. E 3rd Tennessee Cavalry. This unit fought throughout Middle Tennessee and northern Alabama. He was captured at Athens, Alabama, September 24, 1864. His unit was moved to the Confederate prison, Castle Morgan, at Cahaba, Alabama. The prison, located at the confluence of the Cahaba River and the Alabama River, was housed in a 15,000 square feet cotton warehouse. By the end of the war, it housed 3000 men. For most of the winter of 1865, Castle Morgan was flooded. As the war wound down, General Grant finally agreed to a prisoner exchange. The prisoners were paroled at Camp Fisk at Vicksburg, MS, on March 21, 1865. My great grandfather was admitted to a hospital in Vicksburg March 21, 1865. The same day because he was so ill, he was sent to Jefferson Barracks, MO, on either the "Henry Ames" or the "Olive Branch" steamboats. Then on March 31, 1865, he was transferred to the General Hospital at Benton Barracks, MO. The able-bodied men of the 3rd Tennessee Cavalry were put on the "Sultana". The "Sultana", which was built for about 500 passengers, was loaded with 2,300 passengers and left Vicksburg on April 24 bound for Camp Chase, OH. The steamboat stopped in Memphis on April 26. Just after leaving Memphis, TN, early on the morning of April 27, 1865, the "Sultana's" boilers exploded with more than 1800 men killed. Most of the 3rd Tennessee was lost. If my grandfather had not been ill when he was released, then I would not be here today.

#### **Helping Hands**

he Coves' Helping Hands Club has been meeting since July, 2007. It started as a "neighbor helping neighbor" program as there was a recognized need, among the aged and infirmed and some with very limited fixed incomes, for assistance to remedy maintenance complaints resulting from the periodic inspections written by the Park's Manager.

Helping Hands, organized by retired Nurse Practitioner, Joyce Clark, assembled a team of volunteer workers with a variety of maintenance skills. Their roster was comprised of resident Handy Men and Women



who had reputations for skill and integrity. Not to deplete the employment opportunities for these workers, each enrolled and recommended helper agreed to provide his services gratis, or at a suitably reduced price when Helping Hands could vouch for the resident client as being unable to pay in full or in part. These cadres of resident helpers are fully licensed for their technical skills. Among the volunteers are cooks and cleaners, drivers to appointments and prescription pickups, as well as caring companions for our seniors and their pets.

A recent development in 2010 grew from learning of several residents who were being assisted within their homes by the organization Mederi Care Tenders, a local Nursing organization. Coordinating with our Helping Hands Club, Mederi began offering free Wellness Training Seminars in our Clubhouse. They have offered free training by Nurses and various Physical Therapists devoted to home caring for the many familiar challenges faced by our senior residents. With focus on a specific theme at each seminar (hearing, vision, balance, diet, etc.), our residents have been grateful for these educational sessions.

The opportunities for free Wellness Seminars have been expanded to include a new series "Ask The Doctor". After an extensive search and interviews, Helping Hands has recruited the free medical counseling services of a local Cardiologist/Urologist, Dr. Herman Zaharowitz, who gives a presentation bi-monthly in the Atrium for Cove residents. These very stimulating and informative lectures have truly been appreciated, especially due to the doctor's easy speaking style and the scope of the technology explained in everyday language.

We look forward to a growing Cove audience at these informative Wellness Seminars.




