A Little About Our Association

If you watch the news or even pick up a newspaper, from time to time you're likely to hear or see many unfavorable stories about HOAs. It's true that some HOAs are completely out of control with excessive and overbearing covenants and restrictions. It's also true that some HOAs are abusive with their powers by charging outrageous non-compliance fees, placing liens on properties if non-compliance fees aren't paid within 30 days, and some are going so far as forcing homes to go into foreclosure because of these liens for fairly small amounts, in comparison with the homes cost and value. What these stories don't tell you though is that not all HOAs are like this, and The Villages of Wexford Association is living proof of this! We're not like the HOAs in the news.

The Villages of Wexford Association has low annual dues of only \$35 for the year. This is less than many other communities charge for a MONTHLY rate. The Villages of Wexford Association's covenants and restrictions are clearly published on our website and available in the County Land Records department. If you ever have a question about the contents, you're welcome to contact us any time.

We do not have silly or excessive restrictions, we respect our residents and neighbors enough to recognize that some things just don't need to be micromanaged by a community association. For most issues, city and county laws and ordinances are enough, and these are enforced by CMPD and Charlotte-Mecklenburg Zoning. The Villages of Wexford Association will never put a lien on your property, nor be the cause of any resident or family losing their home to foreclosure.

Neighborhood Improvements

- In May 2011, the Villages of Wexford Association sponsored and completed the Spring Landscaping Day event.
- In May July 2011 a door-to-door neighborhood watch campaign was conducted. We received enough participation forms and signatures to qualify as a neighborhood watch community. We are now working with CMPD to obtain appropriate signage for the community to be displayed near the main entrances.
- In October 2011, the Villages of Wexford Association sponsored and completed the Fall Landscaping Day event which focused on updating the landscaping around the neighborhood signs at Shandon Way Lane and Harris Houston Road and around the neighborhood sign at Leadenhall Lane and Harris Houston Road.
- In Phase 1 of a 3 Phase project, the main entrance neighborhood sign and the neighborhood sign on the island at Flint Glenn Lane and Oak Leigh Drive were replaced.

Committees in our Community

Landscaping Committee

The entrance to a neighborhood can do a lot to give a good first impression for visitors and prospective new neighbors. The responsibility of the Landscape Committee is to keep these area maintained.

Welcoming & Social Committee

Our goal is to welcome new neighbors to the community and plan and organize opportunities to help build cohesiveness throughout the community. This committee relies heavily on neighbors and block captains for information regarding new neighbors to insure all receive a warm welcome.

Block Captain & Communications Committee

Block captains are the Association's eyes and ears of the community. Block captains provide information to the Welcoming & Social Committee regarding new neighbors, they also work closely with the Board members in regard to communicating successes and concerns within their area of the community. Block Captains are also responsible for distributing newsletters or flyers from the Association to neighbors in their areas.
