YARD MAINTENANCE

Winter is here. Remember to keep your lawns and trees/shrubs trimmed and neat, fertilize and water as needed (the drought is still here). If your grass is dead or very thin under your trees, the trees may need to be thinned to let sunlight through to the grass. It also is a good time to remove weeds from the flower beds and lawns, add mulch where needed and possibly add compost to improve soil quality. Keeping up with maintenance in the upcoming cool weather will make our yards easier to maintain next spring and summer.

TRASH

Please note that Sheffield garbage pickup is **twice weekly**, on **Tuesday and Friday** (heavy trash day). Please DO NOT put your trash out at the curb until the night before pickup (**Monday and Thursday**). Tree trimmings should be in three-foot lengths and tied together if possible. Items such as televisions and computer monitors should not be put in the trash, but instead taken to a recycling center or to a trash site that takes these items. Harris County has special trash events 1-2 times yearly. Contact the Precinct 3 office for more information. Carpet and padding are also items that the trash company will not take. Please have your contractor dispose of these for you. Also, please do not store your trash cans in plain sight of the street. Keep them in your garage, behind your fence or elsewhere out of sight. Thank you for your cooperation.

LITTER PICKUP

Just a reminder, if you see trash in the neighborhood, please be a good neighbor and pick it up and dispose of it properly. Otherwise, then trash will either end up in someone's shrubbery or trees or else get washed down the storm sewers, contributing to mosquito breeding and backing up of the storm drains in times of heavy rains. Thanks to those of you who regularly pick up other people's litter.

PETS

Please remember that you are not allowed by law to let your dogs and cats run loose in the neighborhood. If caught, you may receive a ticket in the amount of up to \$500 for such a violation (we have had residents receive such a ticket). If you see loose pets you can contact Harris County Animal Control. A number of Sheffield residents either walk their dogs or let their cats run loose. It is a violation of deed restrictions to let your pet leave their poop on another resident's lawn or the common grounds (they belong to all of Sheffield's residents). If your pet does have to go to the bathroom, please be courteous and carry a plastic bag (store bags or the newspaper delivery bag are great for this), pick up the pile by placing your hand inside the bag, grab the pile through the bag, tie the bag up and throw it in the garbage. Leaving your pet waste around encourages the possible spread of pet disease, such as Parvo, which can be life threatening, or parasites. A number of complaints have been made about stray cats roaming the neighborhood. To report stray or unconfined animals call 281-999-3191, Monday thru Friday during the hours of 9:00 AM until 6:00 PM.

PLAYGROUND

The wrought iron fence has been installed for youth safety purposes along the east side of the neighborhood playground. It sure looks nice. There still is graffiti on the main playground equipment. Inclement weather has prevented volunteer cleanup. Hopefully the graffiti will be removed by the time this notice is published.

RECIPES WHIPPED LIME DESSERT

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 (3 ounce) package lime flavored gelatin mix
- 1 cup boiling water
- 1 cup cold evaporated milk
- 1 (12 ounce) package vanilla wafers, crushed

DIRECTIONS:

In a medium bowl, whisk together the gelatin and boiling water until dissolved. Refrigerate until thickened to the consistency of egg whites, about 1 hour.

When the gelatin is thick, whip the evaporated milk in a chilled bowl with chilled beaters until thick enough to form peaks like whipped cream. Fold the whipped milk into the gelatin. Rinse an 8 cup mold and fill with the gelatin mixture. Cover and refrigerate overnight, or at least until set, about 4 hours.

Unmold the gelatin onto a serving dish and sprinkle with cookie crumbs. Put the rest of the crumbs into a bowl and pass around the table at serving time.

TRIFLE

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 (12 ounce) container frozen whipped topping, thawed
- 1 (8 ounce) container sour cream
- 1 (9 inch) angel food cake
- 1 (3.4 ounce) package instant vanilla pudding mix
- 3 kiwis, peeled and sliced
- 1 pint fresh strawberries, sliced
- 3 bananas, peeled and sliced
- 1 (15 ounce) can crushed pineapple, drained
- 1 sprig fresh mint

DIRECTIONS:

In a medium bowl, fold sour cream and unprepared pudding mix into the whipped topping.

Cut the cake into thirds, horizontally.

Line a large trifle or other glass serving bowl with kiwi and strawberry slices, reserving two whole strawberries and two kiwi slices. Place one layer of cake in bottom of bowl, top with 1/3 of bananas and pineapple, and 1/3 of whipped topping mixture. Repeat layering until all ingredients are used.

Make fan garnishes of whole strawberries by slicing from just below the stem. Garnish assembled trifle with fanned strawberries, reserved kiwi slices, and a sprig of mint. Refrigerate until serving. Source: <u>allrecipes.com</u>, Submitted by: Joy

MARCH GARDENING TIPS

VEGETABLES

• Plant vegetables such as tomatoes, sweet corn and snap beans and pepper, as well as cucumbers, lima or butter beans, cantaloupe, okra (if the soil has warmed sufficiently - 70 degrees F. or higher), southern peas, pumpkin, squash, peanuts and watermelon.

LAWN

- Re-sod or replant as needed with turfgrasses adapted to this part of Texas and suited to the planting location (shade or sun).
- When resodding semi-shaded areas with St. Augustine, use ONLY the variety Floratam for best pest resistance. See www.plantanswers.com/grass.htm.

TREES AND SHRUBS

· Plant container-grown trees and shrubs as soon as possible. In

shady areas, where grass is difficult to grow, consider planting a dependable groundcover such as English ivy, Asian jasmine, vinca or one of the prostrate junipers.

- Prune spring flowering and evergreen shrubs during **early March**. However, be sure to prune spring flowering shrubs after they have bloomed.
- Fertilize with a pre-plant application of a slow-release fertilizer analysis such as 19 5 9 at the rate of 3 pounds per 100 square feet of garden planting area. **Early March** is the ideal time to fertilize landscape plants because you give them food just before the spring growing season starts.
