





In many recent major disasters, phones (land line and cell), commercial TV & radio, fire and police radios were not working. Amateur radio was the only reliable means of communication.

EmComm preparedness means being ready to get out and get on the air.









EmComm volunteer operators should be able to set up and get on the air within 60 minutes of a disaster or being called into service.

Keep It simple. Be ready. Get on the air.








KI6NQG (Dennis) has his EmComm field radio system in 1 box ready to go and get on the air.

The EmComm bottom line: It isn't the size / power of the equipment or operator but the quality (effectiveness, clarity, and reliability) of the operator and their ability to communicate.


