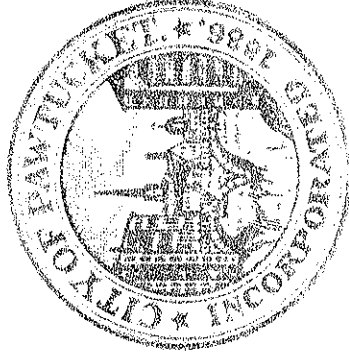


Proclamation
