SNA Projects & Accomplishments by Katie Zender

So, you might be wondering what the Sedgefield Neighborhood Association has been doing lately? Well, here's an update on some of our activities and accomplishments over the last few years. Projects do not move quickly and we've learned that constant attendance and vigilance is all that's really required. Squeaky wheel syndrome still rules!

- Ongoing involvement with the Charlotte Housing Authority (CHA) so we can impact the re-development of Savannah Woods and along with what happens with the corner parcel next to it, at Marsh & Park Road.
- Reminding the school system of their promise to us to tear down the old elementary buildings and create a neighborhood park. If you'd like to

join the group dedicated to the design of this area, please let Janelle Travis know. This summer, the buildings come down!

- Closing down the old Carrousel Club on South Blvd!
- Neighborhood infrastructure improvements along Poindexter, Sedgefield Rd, Wriston & Dorchester.
- Stop signs on Hartford in 2009, slowing traffic for those who live on that former "raceway."
- Road humps throughout the neighborhood Greystone Avenue is the latest recipient.
- Tree banding for elderly in our neighborhood each November.
- Every May we celebrate our neighborhood with Sedgefest, held in our beautiful neighborhood park. Redevelopment of the park was long-term SNA project, working with the Parks and Recreation Department and

Stormwater Departmentt for years, to finally reach completion.

Various SNA members have been participating in numerous stakeholder groups, currently called Citizen Advisory Groups (CAG):

- o Height In Residential Districts (HIRD), concluded
- o Park Road Corridor Study, concluded
- o Park Woodlawn Area Plan, ongoing
- o Incentive Based Inclusionary Housing (IBHI), ongoing
- o Assisted Multi-Family Housing at Transit Stations, almost complete

We also have a wish list and would love any other ideas from neighbors:

- Pedestrian-height street lights.
- Petition for a "road diet" for Marsh Road and Poindexter.
- Petition to stop the continuation of Poindexter beyond Youngblood.

New Neighbors Coming Soon!!

According to Planning Staff's Allen Goodwin, we will be getting lots of new neighbors soon along the light rail line..

- 1. On New Bern street behind 3030 South, Profit Dickson Partners are building 208 new apartments named the Fountains.
- 2.Across South Blvd.. facing the Healthy Home Market/Sedgefield Shopping Center, Colonial Grand is beginning construction, parking deck in the center. (I had hoped that area would be left for green space.) This project will be home for 341 apartments.
- 3. Woodfield Silos crossing the train tracks behind Colonial will have 277 units with surface parking. Greatly downsized from the original project on this parcel, thankfully.
- 4. Coming on up north along the train line at Remount and Dunavant corner, South Line townhouse are going up. Cherokee South Line are the developers for 281 townhomes.

So it looks like we will soon be sharing our streets with 1,107 new residents. Home office anyone?




