tributed. They have called a special meeting so that they can get all the captains familiar with their residents and streets. Please do your part by making sure your personal property is secure.

Notice went out on MAROA that SWFWMD is calling for water restrictions. There seems to be a little confusion on what days you are allowed to water. We fall under the St Petersburg City Restrictions, not the County, therefore the even numbered homes can water on Saturdays and the odd number homes on Sundays. The county days are opposite, with watering allowed during the week only.

Remember that these restrictions are effective through July 31, 2012, unless extended or rescinded.continued on page 9

A new sheet was generated in the office for anyone wanting to schedule an event at the Tiki Hut. This being a common area, it cannot be completely off limits to other residents, nor does it fall under private parties. It just gives notification that there will be a group gathering so people can plan accordingly.

Due to several months of delinquencies of \$1,994.45 and the expense of foregoing of eviction procedures, we have offered an agreement to 6904 Mt Pleasant to relinquish all equity in their share which amounts to \$4,189.42 plus the share amount of \$37,500.00. This is a profit of \$39, 694.97.

share can transfer that share to the new space. Should a share certificate be returned to the association to sell, it can be sold for the current market price, and the seller would be paid the amount of the original purchase price, and the association would gain the difference.

GROUNDS:

The home that we own at 7061 Mt Deleon Rd will need to be pulled out. It's infested with termites, has rodents and was damaged during the last storm. Gary Lehman will be pulling it out and removing the concrete slab, driveway and misc. concrete for \$3,500.00.

A loose fan in the kitchen refrigerator was repaired by "Right Now Refrigerator". It was under warranty so there was no charge.

Pinellas County Electric replaced the irrigation pump control box for the south side wells that were not running due to the wires being melted. The cost was \$700.00.

The pool was closed on Monday, May 21st after 2:00 pm to repair 2 small cracks. It reopened on Tuesday.

A new grill and cover were purchased for the pool area at the cost of \$402.54. Also purchased was a new projector to help the computer club and to begin "Movie Night", which started Thursday, May 17that 7:00 pm in the clubhouse. The policy will be that the projector be kept in the office and will need to be signed out. That person will be responsible for returning it the next day.

I have asked Matthews Lawn Service to review the landscape evaluation report that we received and give us his recommendations. He would like to prune back the oleanders



and hibiscus plants throughout the property, which should be done at this time of year to promote new growth. By doing this, it would reduce the frequency of trimming these bushes and allow them to bloom more. As far as the turf, there is not a lot that can be done about the mixture of the turf without major re-sodding of these areas. Matthews has hired Tru-Green at their own expense to start treating the turf with insecticide, herbicide and fertilizer to help improve the quality of the turf, He has also recommended that the grass strip between the office and the shuffleboard court be removed and a ground cover be planted, such as jasmine minima.

The irrigation system is antiquated and should have the required rain sensors installed. Matthew is willing to check into this and see how many would be needed and what the cost would be. They check the sprinklers on a regular basis and repair or replace as needed.

The palm trees are pruned the least amount possible, keeping in mind to keep them off the homes. They have to be trimmed a certain amount or there would be a weekly list of fronds needing to be trimmed.

To help beautify several of the empty lots, I asked Matthew's for a quote to seed vacant lots with Pensacola Bahia grass seed. The park would be responsible for watering it. He would be willing to do 2 lots at a time and the cost would be \$200.00 per lot. We would then have maintenance add 2 sprinkler heads to the seeded lots with a manual shut off switch.

Please be more careful when using the Air-Pressure Hose. We had to replace the nozzle more that necessary, and actually the same day a new one had just been purchased. Please take the time to return it to its proper holder and wind it up the best you can when you are finished.




Note: Since July 4th falls on a Wednesday, trash pickup will remain the same as usual that week – Tuesday and Friday.






Crafters
