

Understand Computers?

E ver been in a store or bank when the computer system went out? The chaos that follows is a good illustration of how important these little "do everything" machines have become in our daily lives.

Many of us retired before or when the computer movement started to move out of the large-



room main frame and punch card era and into the PC or micro computer period.

It is easier to say "I don't understand it, and don't want to learn" but this thinking often gets in the way of carrying on a semi-intelligent conversation with children and grandchildren and others of the younger generation.

I chose to join up with the movement, in a small way so far, but have even threatened to replace my toy 8-year old antique machine with something out of the pages of the many computer business and hobby magazines you see on the shelves at Kash and Karry.

Computing is only the beginning and for most a small part of what a PC will do. These pages of the Forecaster, as well as those of the TIMES and various magazines, come from computer-generated type of various styles and sizes, including headlines.

This function (word processing) has replaced the linotype machine, that clinkingclanking unit that produced hot lead type for many generations of printers and publishers. Few among us ever thought that the linotype machine would not live forever!

A writer or editor can put a story on the screen, correct or shorten, rewrite or otherwise improve, and send it on to a printer (a machine, not a man) to produce type. All this has impacted the work force of newspapers and publishing houses, but it seems to be something that had to happen for them to stay in business.

The same machines, with different software, run small and large business offices. All kinds of memos, letters, legal and other documents, annual reports, and other printed products come from office computers.

Computing? Many of them will do sophisticated problem solving and are used in long range planning, statistical and market analysis, and for all kinds of number crunching.

Improvements have come along so fast that we wonder how far it all can go. When many of us thought that the machines are getting so small and so fast that not much else can happen, along comes the Pentium chip, the CD-ROM and who knows what else.

If you have young family members or friends, check out how many of them make a living and/or do personal writing and record keeping on a computer. Almost all of ours do, including one computer engineer.continued on page 16A

Another advantage of computers comes from the way they can "talk" to each other, on office lines or nationwide on phone or leased lines.

Information exchange systems such as Prodigy, Online, and Internet make it possible to exchange data quickly at long distances. PCs may also connect into information libraries or storehouses (data bases) in nothing flat.

The language computers speak and understand is interesting. There are the Apple-Macs on one side of the aisle and the IBMs or IBM compatibles on the other. You can get arguments as to which is better, but at least there is now software that has them talking across the aisle to each other.

Texas Hold'em By Pat Sanborn






Pill Pool By Sandie Reid



For all those wondering what "pill pool" is, which is played at 6:00pm on Tuesday in the billiard room:

Type Of Game

Pill Pool, sometimes called Pea Pool or Kelly Pool, is a pool game played with 15 numbered object balls, 15 numbered pills (or peas) and a shake bottle, also known as Pill bottle. The 15 pills are shaken in the bottle and each player gets one



Object Of Pill Pool

Pill pool is a rotation game whereby the cue ball must first hit the lowest numbered ball on the table. The object of the pool game is to pocket the ball with the same number as the pill that was given at the start of the game and to "kill" the opponents' object balls by sinking their numbered object balls.

When a player's object ball has been pocketed by the opponent, (i.e. kills the ball) the former must discard the killed pill and resign from the game. To win in Pill pool, a player must either pocket his ball legally or kill the ball of his last competitor.
