# Notes VHMN QTRLY MEETING July 19, 2012

Call to order: 5:41 pm

Welcome and introductions:

Welcome to new members from our current area and guests from our expansion area

Meetings start at 6:30 to be over by 8:00

Usually the City guests speak 1<sup>st</sup> so they can leave, but tonight we want to start with results of our survey to extend boundaries so that City guests know the area they are speaking to.

Survey - 125 possible households: 60 were contacted and only 2 said No.

New area explained and noted on displayed map

Parks: No one available tonight. We do have a park and it is one of the best sledding hills in Des Moines. It is not ADA approved. It has the last remaining merry-go-round.

Zoning: Dennis Rule

Usual calls: Junk debris, Parking violations, curb items
Report vacant houses because they can become trouble
If putting items on curb, put address on sticker. They sometimes get stolen
Report of a house with cars in the front yard in the new area.
Quiet neighborhoods

Police: Our normal Neighborhood Officer Doua Lor is not here tonight because of a death in the family. In his place welcome Officer Gonzales who is also filling in for him until the 25<sup>th</sup>.

- Passed out 2011 Annual Report
- There are 57 neighborhoods supported by 6 or 7 officers.
- We would like to see the no parking sign on Winegardner moved further from the corner. It is hard to see around and make that corner safely with the little room provided
- Provide mobile speed camera and signs when requested
- Traffic at top of hill on University at E 36<sup>th</sup> court. People are going too fast to see well and react to traffic conditions as they come over the hill
- Iowa State Fair:
  - State Troopers provide security inside and average 130 arrests
  - o Des Moines Police patrol outside and average 12 15 arrests
  - o There will be vans provided by local groups on the last day of the fair towards closing time to make sure everyone gets home
  - o The Westbound entrance to 33<sup>rd</sup> St. gate is closed when there are not enough officers there to handle the traffic from both directions
  - o Can there be someone on Williams and University to help push people through intersection when traffic gets busy. Maybe Pleasant Hill can help
