# 'Smart Fabric' Could Add An Extra Layer Of Security



hat if your clothing could warn you when someone tried to steal it? Although it's not designed for fashion, German scientists have developed a "smart fabric" made of a conductive web connected to a microcontroller that can sense when threads are cut and trigger an alarm.

Clothes may not be the next step, but the fabric could be useful in protecting banks, cars, and buildings. A layer of the material could be laid through a building like insulation, offering an extra level of security should criminal break through it at any point. It could also be integrated into concrete walls and barriers, or used with floor coverings to detect unauthorized footsteps. Whether it will ever be useful as a necktie, though, remains to be seen.

Dear Residents,

ope you all had a wonderful Thanksgiving holiday and enjoyed reuniting with family and friends.

By now, you should have received your First Notice of Annual Membership Meeting that will take place on Wednesday, January 16th, 2013. If you haven't received it, please stop in the office for a copy.

Here are some important dates:

**December 14, 2012** – our Second Notice of Annual Meeting will be mailed specifying the agenda along with Board Candidates' Bios and a ballot for election. Please remember, if you are submitting intent to run for the Board, it has to be in our office no later than **December 5th, 2012**. You will then need to submit your information sheet (bio) no later than 4:00 pm on **December 11th, 2012**. This information Bio sheet will be mailed out with the voting ballots thirty (30) days prior to the Annual Meeting.

I would like to remind you that all mobile homes must have a RP – Real Property Decal that must be visible from the street. This is per code. If you are not showing proof of being registered with the State, you may be subject to a fine of several hundred dollars. RP Decals can be obtained through your Motor Vehicle office with a photo ID.

On another note, I have received many complaints about residents not stopping at stop signs. It was observed that only one (1) in every eight (8) people seems to stop, including golf carts. Stop Signs should be observed by all, including cars, golf carts and bicycles.

Another complaint that needs to be addressed again is pets. Pets are not allowed in the common areas and non-pet section per your Rules & Regulations. Please remember, not all people are dog lovers, and they have their rights as well. Please follow the rules you agreed to when moving into this park. We shouldn't have to waste the shareholders' funds on violation letters and attorney fees for not obeying the rules. Please keep your pets out of the non-pet areas.

I have asked our street cleaner to be a little more road friendly. The reason they drive in the same direction is due to it providing a better cleanup since the drive side has the suction. This way debris doesn't end up in your driveway.

One final note I would like to share with you is that this is our time of the year that we get pretty busy around here. o you need a Listserv Robot? We have one for you, here in the Cove. For short it's called the Listbot, or even worse, the listbox. Here's how it works. Any subscriber, (there is never any charge) can send an e-mail to maa2001@ yahoogroups.com.

°[Wait a minute you must be a subscriber (260 today), and only Cove residents can subscribe]. Your e-mail is <u>instantly</u> forwarded to all of the subscribers. Yes, you can

include pictures or any other attachments.

There are three modes for delivery of Listbot messages. (1) Daily E-mail: When any Cove subscriber sends a message, it appears in your e-mail Inbox immediately.

(2) Daily Digest: Early every morning you receive an index list of the messages that were posted the day before. You are free to select from the index items of interest to read, items to print, or items to delete [maybe some authors you particularly don't like].

(3) No E-mail: No Listbot messages appear in your Inbox, but.....you can go to our archive and view (or print) everything you may have missed.....at your convenience, when so moved! After registering for archive access (free), you can check on the "Bot" messages from any computer, anywhere in the world.

There are no commercial advertisements on the "Bot" unless you want to sell your wheelchair, your boat or your house.


