Crime Watch Procedures

Steps1: If you are involved in an incident, call 911 to report the incident.

Step 2: Call SHNA Crime Watch at 469-619-7867.

Step 3: The Crime Committee will update the hotline message & post crime alert signs at the entrances of the neighborhood.

Step 4: Neighbors can call the crime watch hotline to receive the most current information on incidents in our neighborhood.

Remember: Call "911" immediately to report all suspicious activity. Do not worry that you are bothering the police or about being embarrassed if your suspicions prove to be unfounded. The police prefer to investigate then to be called after the fact. Your call can save a life, prevent an injury or stop a criminal act. Be alert!!!
