Letter from the Manager

E ach day, as I drive through and meet Americana Cove's residents, I try to introduce myself with a smile. I hope we can all start off on the right foot. Well, I am left-handed; so perhaps I should say, I want to put my best foot forward and I would like for us all to have a clean slate. I can do nothing to change the past; I cannot do anything to change what previous managers did or did not do. The only thing I CAN do is what I feel would be best for Americana Cove at this time.



I want to assure the shareholders and residents that I did not know anyone here prior to May of this year. I did not know any of the current or past board members. I did not know any of the employees or any of the wonderful volunteers who work so hard to make this a really great community.

Although I am not from Missouri and have never lived there, I am a "show me" person. By that I mean, if someone tells me something, I usually need to see documentation before I consider it a fact. Not that I think anyone would mislead me, I just like to see things for myself and form my own opinions based on facts.

I have started doing inspections in the community; and I am starting everyone off with a clean slate, no second or third notices for the upkeep of homes. I will be sending everyone a copy of the inspection report I do on their home. If there are no items that need to be corrected, I have added an option that reads, "Thank you for maintaining your property in accordance with the community's standards." If there are items like homes needing to be power washed or anything that requires the use of water, the city's water use restrictions prevent us from requesting owner clean their homes or irrigate their lawns; however, when I do the next inspection on your property, in approximately six (6) months, you will be asked to comply so try to beat me to it once the restrictions are lifted.

I am enjoying my time at Americana Cove and hope to meet everyone soon. There are a few items I want to ensure you are aware of that are happening behind the scenes, so to speak.

Hurricane Preparations – We will be holding a community wide Hurricane Storm Awareness Meeting on July 17 at 10:00 a.m. in the Atrium. We desperately need some block captains; if you have the time to help, please consider volunteering. Again this year, Barbara Gallant has agreed to chair this committee but we will need to recruit another volunteer for 2014. Thank you so much, Barbara!

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Irrigation – Lawn and Landscape Water Use Rules for Potable, Private Well and Surface Water Sources: Hand watering of non-lawn landscape is allowed any day, if needed; but it is now prohibited between 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. An automatic shutoff device (hose nozzle) must be installed on your hose and used at all times. Hand watering of lawn/turf is restricted to one day a week during designated hours on assigned days which is Saturday or Sunday. Micro-irrigation (low-flow or drip irrigation) is allowed any day, if needed, but is now prohibited between 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. A big thank you to Jim Huff, for providing this helpful information from the city's website so I could provide it to everyone!

Communicate – Question and Answer Session with Manager and Board – I look forward to meeting more of you on Wednesday mornings; I want to provide residents with an opportunity to meet me and share opinions, ask questions, or just chat. When this idea was suggested to Billy Seablom, the MAROA Board President, he wanted to join me whenever possible too. Come join us if you are able at the Atrium on Wednesday mornings from 11:00 to 11:45 a.m.

Property Inspections – As I mentioned earlier, I have started doing inspections. I determined that according to the governing documents, every home is to be inspected two (2) times per year. In order to accomplish that, I will need to inspect approximately 25 homes per week. As soon as I finish the last one, it will be time for me to start on the second round.

Paving – I have obtained a proposal for resurfacing the parking lot and seal coating the remainder of the streets. I then prepared a Request for Proposals and sent it out to four (4) other asphalt companies so I will be able to provide the board of Directors with several qualified bids based on the same set of specifications.

Recycling – It has been brought to my attention that we need to do a better job of sorting our recyclables. We are waiting on a container that will separate the clear bottles from the green and other



colored bottles. I understand Joan Martin does more than her share of keeping the recyclables in order – thank you, Joan!

Lawn Spraying – The Board has contracted with TruGreen to treat the lawns 6 times per year. At first, we thought TruGreen was going to allow owners to sign up for other months on their own and they still will. However, individual owners will need to call TruGreen themselves. Individual owners will need to work through the residential side of TruGreen and not the commercial side the association deals with. *If you do not want any spraying on your lawn, please let us know and we will add you to the No Spray List.*

MISC – There are several other small projects that we are working on such as having the clubhouse floor stripped and waxed, painting the guardhouse, the stage and laundries.

AMCOVE EMAIL –AMCOVE is a direct email service offered to all residents of Americana Cove. It will provide business news, notification of community meeting times and dates, meeting agendas, public service notices such as water shut offs, hurricane warnings, etc.

I look forward to meeting more of you each week! I want everyone to know how happy I am to be here; I am enjoying working with Barbara, Mary and Tina in the office, and with David, Jim and Paula in maintenance. I could never forget the wonderful gate attendants Carolyn, Gerry, Gloria, Jennie, Ken and Rosie!

Thank you all for making me feel so welcome!

Real Estate Sales Strong In Traditionally Slow Months By Barefoot Realty Group Brokerage Agent for Americana Cove



The months of June, July and August are traditionally the slowest for real estate in manufactured housing communities. It has not been slow at Americana Cove, however.

Currently we have three homes that will be closing in the next two to three weeks and another Palm Harbor home that was purchased for lot 372 Mt. Richmond that will be set up in August. There have been two additional Palm Harbor homes sold this year that are set up and new owners are in the process of moving in.

The Americana Cove Sales website (www.americanacovesales.com) has seen increased traffic as well. In the past 30 days, there have been 755 first-time visitors to the site and 943 returning visitors for a total of 1,698 visitors to the site. Not surprisingly, the listings of homes for sale are the most viewed pages on the site; and the listings have been viewed 2,782 times in the past 30 days. So, potential home buyers are definitely shopping online.

Here's The Very Latest... For Salad Lovers

ash and dry pint or quart size Mason Jars. Lay out all salad fixings, such as

onion, celery, grated carrots, baby tomatoes, ripe olives sliced, blueberries, cucumbers, green pepper, and etc.etc. All lettuce and spinach and last, hard-boiled egg...



Chop all ingredients that need to be smaller, and have jars lined up.

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- 1. In the bottom of each jar (depends on the size of the jar and your own recipe for dressing), use Italian, for instance...1 to 2 Tablespoons on bottom. (I use one Tbsp ea, vinegar and Olive oil.)
- 2. Start layering in each jar, saving lettuce and hard-boiled egg until last.
- 3. You want the ingredients to stack up...do not shake or stir.
- 4. My first jars, dressing, onion, carrot grated, green pepper, blueberries, ripe olives sliced, cherry tomatoes sliced in half, 1 tbsp Sunflower seeds..Add the lettuce pieces and a hand full of fresh spinach, squeezed in at the top finally a hardboiled egg cut in half.
- Л
- 5. Put the lid on, DO NOT SHAKE, AND refrigerate. You working gals can make FIVE jars at a time, great for lunches, or quarts make great dinner...add chopped cooked chicken after plating.
- 6. Before serving, turn over for a few minutes, pour out onto plate, and ready!!

Getting everything chopped and ready at the same time is so fun...but having salad all done without the chore is really great!

Next time I'm going to try adding green beans, cheese, and cooked pasta with pepperoni.

FIRST TIME: I tried one pint jar and one quart jar. I made these while making my dinner salad, and just divided all the ingredients. I tested the Pint Jar after 3 days, and everything was fresh and crisp...a wonderful idea! Tonight I will test the 5 day Quart Jar.

The original directions also suggested that instead of storing lettuce and spinach in plastic bags, tear them and store them without dressing Mason Jars in the refrigerator. They will last longer.

Salad in a jar will last 7 days and take up less room in the refrigerator, than all those bags and plastic dishes. Think what a time saver when doing meals in advance for shut-ins!

We may have hit on something BIG!!
