January 26 - Park Terrace Condominium, 1611 Spring Drive. Program: Harry Pickens. Community Transformation...In The Key Of Jazz! How the "skills of jazz" can help us create a more vibrant, sustainable, and welcoming Louisville. Harry Pickens is an internationally recognized jazz pianist, educator and composer and recipient of the Kentucky Governor's Award for The Arts In Education. Featured in an Emmy™ Award Winning KET Documentary, "Harry Pickens - In the Garden Of Music," Harry currently serves as Ambassador for Artistry in Education at the Berklee College of Music.

February 23 - **The Commodore**, corner of Bonnycastle and Cowling Aves. **Program: Tom Owen.** *Top of the Hill Louisville, First Highlands.* Tom Owen was elected as one of the original members of the Louisville Metro Council in 2002; the Bonnycastle neighborhood is included in the area he represents. Councilman Owen is a full professor at the University of Louisville and has been a history instructor, archivist, and community relations associate at U of L since 1968. He is well known as a local historian and is a frequent contributor to radio and television features. Owen conducts tours of local sights and is a speaker on state and local history.

March 23 – Home of Jessica Loving and Sheryl Snyder, 1616 Cherokee Rd. Program: Tracy Campbell. Why Do Our Cities Look The Way They Do?: Lessons From The St. Louis Riverfront And The Gateway Arch. Tracy Campbell is Professor of History at the University of Kentucky. He has written four books, including Short of Glory: The Fall and Redemption of Edward F. Prichard, Jr., (1998) which was nominated for a Pulitzer Prize, and most recently, The Gateway Arch: A Biography, which was published last year in the Icons of America Series from Yale University Press. Tracy is also co-director of the Wendell Ford Public Policy Research center at the University of Kentucky.
