Recycling your Christmas Tree: NYC Parks Dept. has a program where you can bring your tree to a **drop-off site** from **Saturday**, **January 4 through Sunday**, **January 12**. Leave your tree with Parks Dept. and they will recycle it for you. There is a drop-off site at Indian Field and 233rd Street and VCPE.

The NYC Department of Sanitation will also be conducting special curb side collections for mulching and recycling of Christmas trees from Monday, December 30, 2013 through Wednesday, January 15, 2014.

NYC Department of Sanitation provides regularly scheduled curbside **refuse collection** services for Woodlawn **on Monday and Thursday** and **recycling collection on Thursday**.

There are **NO** garbage or recycling collections on the following Department holidays:

Please remember to set out garbage after 5pm (4pm from October 1 to March 31) on the holiday for collection beginning the next day, which may occur earlier or later than normal. Recyclables should not be put out until the next week, when there are back to back holidays (e.g. two Monday holidays in a row). Recyclables will typically be collected the day after the 2nd holiday.

Snow removal will sometimes change these schedules
