Household Hazardous Waste Round-Up

Acceptable Items

- Oil or solvent based paints, sealers, primers, varnish, polyurethanes, shellacs, spray paint
- Kerosene, gasoline, lighter fluid, automotive fluids
- Pesticides, herbicides, insecticides
- Caustic household cleaners, fluorescent bulbs
- Adhesives, roof tar, driveway sealer
- Mercury

We will not accept latex paint at the Round Up as it is not considered a hazardous material. Latex paint will be picked up with curbside trash if the paint is not in a liquid state. To harden paint, mix it with sand, dirt or kitty litter. Place the uncovered paint can on your treelawn for pickup.

Dear Euclid Resident:

The City of Euclid is under contract with Kimble Companies. Beginning in February 2014 Kimble will start automated collection and disposal of refuse and recyclable materials. Approved containers and informational materials will be distributed to all residents receiving curbside pick-up. The following procedures are recommended to keep this program running smoothly.

Place your bundled refuse on the tree lawn after 6:00 pm Standard Time the day before your collection, or before 7:00 am the day of your collection. If your trash is placed on the tree lawn any earlier, you will be in violation of Ordinance #941.05 which includes a \$500.00 fine that will be strictly enforced. Collection may take place anytime between 7:00 am and 6:00 pm. Waste containers should not exceed 50 lbs. in weight. Empty waste containers are not permitted to remain in the front of any building or residence for a period in excess of twelve hours from the time of collection by the City.

Kimble Companies *will not* pick up trash from a business, even if it is operated out of a private residence.

The following holidays will be observed **if they fall on a weekday**. If the holiday falls on a weekend, trash pick up will remain on schedule. If in doubt, put it out.

Large Items

Oversized items such as appliances, with or without refrigerants, will also be collected on your scheduled day. Remove the door(s) on anything that seals shut (i.e. refrigerator or freezer). Building or construction materials including concrete, dirt and roofing material WILL NOT be collected. These items must be disposed of by the resident. Separate arrangements to dispose of these materials should be made with a contractor at the homeowner's expense.

Insulin Needles The tips of the needles need to be broken off. Place needles in a sealed container (i.e. detergent bottle, coffee can).

Lawnmowers/Snowblowers

Kimble will pick these up curbside after you drain all of the gasoline/oil. Mark with a sign that all flammable liquid has been removed.

Used Motor Oil SHOULD NOT be placed on the tree lawn for collection. Lube Stop, Inc. will accept used motor oil during regular business hours at their shop located at 20501 Euclid Avenue, (216) 486-2555.

Batteries will not be collected curbside. Batteries are accepted at Bulldog Battery located at 37645 Vine Street, Willoughby, 44094. Their phone number is (440) 942-2555.

Branches, Brush and Carpeting must be cut into 3-4 foot lengths and bundled, not to exceed 2' in diameter. Weight should not exceed 50 pounds.

Other various materials will be accepted at the following locations:

Latex Paint is not considered Hazardous Waste and will be picked up as long as it is solidified. To do this, mix the remaining paint with dirt, sand or kitty litter. Once mixture hardens, place uncovered cans on tree lawn for pick up.

Curbside Recycling Collection will take place weekly and will occur on the same day as your trash collection. Approved recyclables can be placed into the container without being sorted.

Some of the items that can be recycled are: plastics #1 through #7; brown, clear or green glass; aluminum, tin or bi-metal cans; newspaper, magazines, corrugated cardboard, telephone books, catalogues, cereal boxes (pull out the liner), printer or copier paper and junk mail. Items that are not accepted include Styrofoam, plastic bags or toys, batteries, light bulbs, wax cartons, wire hangers, aluminum foil and books.

Residents can still drop off paper products at the various Abitibi recycling sites (green and yellow bins) which contribute a portion of the profits to charity. Aluminum cans are also collected at Fire Station #1, 775 East 222nd Street and benefits the Metro Health Burn Unit. Compact fluorescent bulbs can be recycled at The Home Depot, 877 East 200th Street in Euclid.
