#### LAWN CARE HAS A GREAT IMPACT UPON OUR FOUR (4) LAKES!

ith the first day of summer just before us, many around the country are reveling in these longer days by spending time on nature's carpet -- turf grass.



In recent years a discussion has been brewing around the U.S.A. over the supposed impact lawn care has on nearby water sources. Excessive nutrients -- primarily phosphorus and nitrogen -- can enter our lakeseventually to Youngs Creek. This feeds the growth of algae, bacteria and other organisms. While bodies of water require a natural amount of nutrients to thrive, too much can result in an overabundance of algae growth -- called algae blooms -- that can be harmful to aquatic life.

In the right column are steps you may take to keep our nearby waterways healthy, and a pleasure for our future generations:

- **Mow High: Longer grass** is stronger grass because it grows deeper roots.
- **MULCH CLIPPINGS: Leave** clippings on the lawn. **Grass clippings quickly** break down and return valuable nutrients and organic matter back into the soil. Blowing your grass into the street will affect our lakes!
- **USE THE RIGHT FERTILIZER:** Choose a phosphorusfree lawn fertilizer unless a soil test shows a need for this nutrient.
- **LOOK FOR A SLOW RELEASE** FERTILIZER. There is less risk of runoff, giving us all environmental benefits, and a beautiful set of pristine lakes!
