Guide to Garbage Collection and Recycling Services

Curbside Collection includes:

- Household Garbage
 —Materials weighing no more than 50 pounds each must be enclosed in a container no larger 32 gallons and placed within 3 feet of the curb or edge of the road by 6 a.m. on the designated pickup day. NO construction or demolition debris such as fencing, floor tiles, etc. is allowed curbside.
- *Yard Waste*—Material must be bagged, bundled or in an easy to handle container and weigh no more than 50 pounds. Limbs and branches must be tied in bundles weighing no more than 50 pounds, be no longer than 4 feet in length with limbs no greater than 6 inches in diameter.
- Appliances and Furniture—Residents should call their designated hauler to schedule a pickup. Appliances and furniture should be placed at the curb for pickup by the hauler. If you do not know who your hauler is contact Customer Service 352-253-1672.
- E-Cycling—Computer monitors and televisions over 19 inches. Call for bulk pickup.

Bulk Pickup Service

Bulk pickup service of 3 cubic yards per pickup is available for residents in the unincorporated area who pay for curbside collection service. This service is included with the collection fee. Items accepted are furniture, appliances and other large household items. Residents must contact the hauler directly for this service.

E-Cycling—Electronic Recycling

Recycling of unwanted household electronics no longer used (i.e. monitors, computers and components is available at the Central Facility). There is no charge for Lake County residents.

Curbside Collection Does NOT include:

- Tires *Auto, boats and associates parts
- * Motor oil * Internal combustion engines
- Hazardous waste * Construction and debris

Any resident of Lake County may recycle their items at any drop-off location. For questions regarding accepted items or disposal fees, call (352) 343-3776.

Recycling Collection

Customers are encouraged to separate their recyclables. Recycling bins will be provided to residential customers by Lake County or your hauler. For information call 352-253-1672.

Residents may place magazines, brown and green bottles, newspaper, clear glass, aluminum and steel cans, plastic bottles with necks, any color #1—#7, and household batteries, placed in a clear plastic bag, in their recycling bin. Cardboard boxes, paste board such as cereal boxes, and cake boxes.

Any resident of Lake County may recycle their items at any drop-off location.

Household Chemical Disposal

Lake County has 5 residential drop-offs and the Central Facility. Materials accepted at these locations include, but are not limited to:

- * used oil * gas & antifreeze (Central Facility)
- * paints and solvents * automotive products
- * household cleaners * pool chemicals
- * rechargeable batteries * lawn & garden supplies Other potentially toxic substances commonly found around the home and garden.
- * cooking oil
