Neglect graffiti and it attracts more graffiti. Here are ways you can help to keep our community free of graffiti.



or symbols applied to any surface – without the consent of the property owner, authorized agent or designee. Graffiti costs taxpayers money, devalues property, and undermines perceptions about safety. Remove graffiti within 24 hours and you help to eliminate the attention that taggers seek.
