A Historic Neighborhood Walking Tour



Welcome to Pasture Point, one of Hampton's oldest neighborhoods. Since the first homes were constructed in the 1890's, Pasture Point has been recognized as a neighborhood with elegant architectural style. As you explore by walking tour, notice the variation of each house. Although many of these historic homes have been modified, diverse architectural elements still distinguish the neighborhood from others of its time.
