Improve Safety and Reduce Crime

- Neighborhood gains a reputation for being aware and for looking out for one another
- Social media updates can help identify people and vehicles and lead to the arrest of criminals
- MPD can focus their resources using "Blue Crush" data analysis with accurate reporting of crimes and suspicious persons/activities
- Greater preparedness helps add a little peace of mind that you've done what you can do to protect your family and possessions
- Be discreet when handling sensitive information

Raise Awareness

- Increases knowledge of what is happening and where...from the people who live there.
- Allows anyone in the community to contribute, learn and interact
- Monitoring MPD's daily CyberWatch email provides a "big picture" you can share
- Using all devices PCs, laptops, tablets and smartphones, awareness is everywhere and instantaneous
- "Always ON"

Old School Social Media

- No social media can replace the value of knowing your neighbors in "real life!"
- Formal or informal Neighborhood Watch groups can provide a good way to get to know your neighbors.
- Social media connections online can lead to real life connections!
- Colonial Acres social media outreach has lead to new members of our neighborhood association!

Facebook

- A "Page" allows more control of content but requires more time to stay current
- A "Group" provides more prominent dialogue between members and can be "closed" to non-members for security
- Allows neighbors to participate and share info, photos, videos, links in real time
- Provides options to create Notes, Events, Photo albums
- Gives your group an "online presence" and identity in the virtual and the real world!

NextDoor.com

- Built specifically for neighborhoods to keep neighbor connected!
- Great features: posts, messages, emailed updates, lost and found pets, classifieds, etc.
- A complete, easy way to take care of Neighborhood Watch-type business
- Only those who live in the boundaries of the group can join- added security
- Nextdoor app is super handy and full of great features like notifications and messages

Twitter

- Like Facebook but more "compact"
- Built for short quick texts of 140 characters or less
- More "trendy" as a means of communication, i.e. Katy Perry 73 Million followers, President Obama 63M, Oprah Winfrey 29M
- Facebook can automatically tweet your Facebook posts!
- Follow leaders in your area for information and updates you can share!

Web Sites, Email & Texts

- Neighborhoodlink.com, other free resources
- > Pay to build and maintain a web site
- Get a volunteer to build and manage a site
- Wix.com- a good resource to build and establish a site
- Email- works, takes more effort, "slower" compared to social media like Facebook
- Texts- instantaneous way to reach out, harder to manage
