GUEST SPEAKER

Calvin Mackie, PH.D.

Speaker, Inventor, Activist and Entrepreneur. Author of "A View From the Roof: Lessons For Life In Business."

Dr. Mackie is managing partner of the Channel Zero Group; chair of the Louisiana Council on the Social Status of Black Boys and Men; and former associate professor of mechanical engineering at Tulane University. A lifelong resident of New Orleans, Dr. Mackie graduated from high school with low SAT scores requiring him to undertake special remedial classes before he was admitted to Morehouse College. He completed his degree in Mathematics, graduating Magna Cum Laude and a member of the prestigious Phi Beta Kappa National Honor Society. He was simultaneously awarded a Bachelors degree in Mechanical Engineering from Georgia Tech, where he subsequently earned his Master and PhD in Mechanical Engineering.



DISTINGUISHED ACHIEVER OF THE YEAR **Congressman John Yarmuth**

U.S. Representative John Yarmuth represents Kentucky's 3rd Congressional District in the U.S. House of Representatives. Now in his fifth term, Congressman Yarmuth serves on the Committee on Energy and Commerce and the Committee on Budget – on which he is the second-ranking Democrat. He has been recognized for his work to improve education, expand access to affordable health care, and revitalize manufacturing in Louisville. Congressman Yarmuth graduated from Atherton High School and Yale University.

Judge Olu A. Stevens is a circuit court judge for the 30th Judicial Circuit in Jefferson County. He was appointed to the court in 2009, and was elected by voters in November 2010.
