Join Blendon Woods' Block Watch

In light of the recent car break-ins, we encourage you to deter criminal activity by getting involved in our Block Watch.

A Block Watch...

- · Creates a greater sense of security in your neighborhood
- Builds bonds with your neighbors
- Stimulates neighborhood awareness
- Increases property values
- Reduces the risk of becoming a victim
- Address quality of life issues
- · Enhances homeland security

With that said, block watches are only as strong as the neighbors that support them. We encourage everyone to attend our meetings or at least join the email list.

Calling the Police

One common question we hear is, "When should I call the police?" Officer Townsend says, "when in doubt, call!"

» Non-emergencies: 614-645-4545

» Emergencies: 911

You can remain completely anonymous when you call by requesting that from the dispatcher when you call.

Solicitations

One common way criminals target for home invasions or burglaries is by pretending to be a solicitor.

Officer Townsend advised not to answer the door, however make sure you make noise in the house so the person at the door can hear someone is home.

A common break-in happens when the burglar thinks no one is home and forces in through the back of the house.

Officer Townsend welcomed calling the police non-emergency line when you see solicitors going through your neighborhood. Solicitors must have a permit to go door-to-door.

He stated the police will send an officer to check credentials and make sure they are allowed to be in the neighborhood.

Crime Prevention

Most crime happens because an opportunity presents itself. For example, car break-ins more often happen when we leave our car door unlocked.

Help prevent crime

- 1) Lock doors and windows to your vehicle and home.
- 2) Invest in outdoor motion sensor lighting. You can find reasonably priced spotlights in stores or online that are quick

3) Get to know your neighbors.

- a. Make it a goal by the end of May to know the 3x3x3 (3 houses to your left, your right and across the street).
- b. Come to our block watch meetings
- c. Participate in neighborhood events

4) Invest in an Alarm System.

There are many good systems on the market and many options. Two ideas:

- a. Monitored (a company is watching the system and alerts police if an alarm goes off): SimpliSafe.com
- b. Unmonitored: GE Home Alarm System

5) Pay attention to Landscaping.

- a. Keep bushes and trees trimmed around your property, and make sure views are not obstructed.
- b. Place thorny bushes around windows, which can help deter criminals from hiding in very uncomfortable places.

6) Call, Call, Call.

When in doubt call! The police are here to protect us, and neighborhoods that work with their police department being their eves and ears are safer.



Changes coming at 161 & Hamilton

Developers have outlined plans for a 330-acre mixed-use development at Route 161 and Hamilton Road, that will reroute Hamilton Rd. and includes 700,000 sq. ft. of offices, 1 million sq. ft. of retail and restaurant space, and up to 800 multifamily units and 130 senior living units at Hamilton Quarter.

The first phase of Hamilton Rd. realignment is scheduled for Oct. 2016.

The rest of the "S-Curve" connecting the Hamilton Rd. exit directly to Hamilton Rd. to the west will be completed early 2017, when other road improvements are slated to begin.

A portion of Dublin Granville Rd. also will be re-located to make way for construction of a Central Blvd. - a walkable "destination" of shops and restaurants in the development.

Construction on the development would begin in late 2016 or early 2017.




