Upper Highlands Neighborhood Association joined the 12 other neighborhood associations and small cities in Metro Council District Eight to sponsor the first Candidate Roundtable. Over 400 people packed the sanctuary of Congregation Adath that had all the seven candidates for Metro Council District Eight answer a myriad of diverse questions ranging from crime to trees to economic development.

Deborah Yetter, The Courier-Journal, and Scott Reynolds, WAVE 3 News, were the moderators with the questions coming entirely from the 13 neighborhood associations and

small cities. This event was streamed live at www.WAVE3.com. Jefferson County Clerk's office registered people as well as to confirmed registrations and polling locations.

Since all of the current candidates are registered Democrats, whoever wins the May 17 primary will most likely be the next council member for District 8. ♣

Parking Guidelines

Parking is always a premium in the Highlands as well as in our neighborhood. We have located some ordinances that are helpful and good to know when using your automobile and parking.


PROPERTY OWNERS and TENANTS must make sure that the following conditions are met:

- Vehicles are permitted to park in the required front or side yard only on a hard surface or approved semi-pervious driveway that does not exceed 20 ft. in width and that leads to a garage, carport, house or rear yard.
- Vehicles must be parked on hard/durable surfaces such as blacktop or concrete and not on dirt or grass
- No vehicle may be parked on a vacant lot.
- No inoperable or unlicensed motor vehicles shall be parked, kept or stored on any premise. (Vehicles may be stored in garage or carport with three sides.)
- No vehicle shall at any time be in a state of major disassembly, disrepair, or in the process of being stripped or dismantled.
- The parking of heavy trucks in residential areas is strictly prohibited. Heavy trucks are trucks, including truck trailers and similar vehicles with two or more rear axles.

The owner of the vehicle and the owner of the property are responsible for preventing and correcting this violation. Fines can be very costly for the property owner or tenant. ♣


