

Denver Century Ride



On June 18th, 2016 Coldwell Banker and Stapleton Denver will be hosting the Denver Century Ride. This is a 100 mile bike race in which the course will proceed through the City of Aurora.

The Aurora Police Department will be conducting Traffic Control for the

portion of the route in the City of Aurora. We want to make notifications to the Aurora Businesses and of course the citizens to bring awareness to this event because it will most likely affect traffic in both residential neighborhoods and businesses.

We will have off duty officers along with our motorcycle unit working this event to try and alleviate the traffic as best as possible. It appears as if the route will come north entering our city through Heather Gardens and go north on S Xanadu St. The route will then go east on E Jewell Ave and continue north on Potomac St Past Aurora South Hospital. It will continue north to E 2nd Ave and then go west to Peoria St and go north from there until it is out of our city. A detailed map of the route can be found at www.denvercenturyride.com. We will have sign boards letting citizens know when this is happening and I will also be passing out flyers along the route to make people aware of what is going on! Difference between 911 and Non-**Emergency number.**

I get asked this question all the time. What is the difference between 911 and the Non Emergency number (303) 627-3100? This is a really good question. Whether you dial 911 or the Non Emergency number, it goes to our dispatch center. They are both good to call but only use 911 during a real emergency. If you don't have the non emergency number programmed in your phone and need to call Police/Fire/EMS, you can always dial 911 and we will respond. More details if you call or email me!

Crime Information

If you would like a more comprehensive list of events that surround your neighborhood you can always go to Raids Online and see what is going on. Raids Online has the ability to filter the following crimes: Homicide, Burglary, Robbery, Theft, Sexual Offenses, Assaults, Property Crimes, Alarms, Arson, Death, Family Offense, Kidnapping, Missing Person, Weapons Offense, Quality of Life, Drugs, Liquor, Traffic, Fire, Proactive/Community Policing, and Vehicle/Pedestrian Stops. Simply pull up the website, select the data you are interested in, along with your address, and it will pull up all the crime data for the time frame you selected. If there is a particular crime that is of concern to you please contact your PAR officer and they will determine if they can release anything about that crime.

Crime Safety Tips

Camping Season is here!





Now you may be asking why I am putting crime safety tips about camping. This is a time to go out with family, friends, and associates and get away from everyone. This is a time to worry about your fishing line rather than answering phone calls at work. I get it.

What people don't realize is that you are away from your home during this time. I have taken many burglary reports when people have gone out of town on vacation and much worse, from a camping trip.

Some simple tips:

- When packing items for the trip, try to do it while not exposing it to the entire city. What I mean by this is as people drive by they are sure you're going camping from you loading your items up. If a burglar drives by he will know you might be gone for some time.
- Secure you home by locking all windows and doors before you leave. There is nothing worse than taking a burglary report and an entry was made through an open window or door. This could have been prevented.
- -Let your close friends or close neighbors know you will be gone and to keep an eye on your place. Let them know that nobody is supposed to be there and to report anything directly to police if someone is snooping around.
- -If gone more than a couple of days, have a close relative, friend, or neighbor check on your place.
- Lock up your valuables in a safe or take them with you! This includes keys to your cars left at home. Don't let them steal your car too!

By taking these steps you are more prepared to make your home safer which means you get to enjoy the great outdoors! This is my favorite time of the year!!
