Wanting The Best For Walker County Residents - And Response (4)

On March 23, 2016 Katie Ward with the TFP wrote an article on the county working to address issues of crime and rundown buildings.

I just wanted to make sure that everyone knew that I brought 20 pictures of abandoned and burned homes to Commissioner Heiskell on Jan. 28, 2015. I explained to her that these had been here for years. I asked for her help with this issue.

I wrote letters, emails and left phone messages for the commissioner and others in Codes and Enforcement on: March 31, Aug. 6, July 28, Sept. 8, Sept. 9, Dec. 9 and Dec. 16.



On Dec. 17, 2015 Commissioner Heiskell responded with an apology of being in the hospital with respiratory issues. She had talked to Sheriff Wilson and learned that crime issues are becoming worse. She said she would get the road man in touch with me in the next few days and see what he can come up with. The road man never visited me.

On Jan. 31, 2016 I wrote the commissioner to let her know the road man never visited me.

I believe it was Feb. 2 or 3 that I wrote Sheriff Wilson asking for help after a daylight break-in at our community. He was in my parking lot within two hours. He came back in two days with five local pastors and a meeting place for a community discussion. This meeting on March 1 was moved to Mission Glen Baptist Church due to the large turnout. The parking lot could not hold the cars.

I bring this article to your attention as well as others at the TFP and WCM, The Chattanoogan.com and Judy O'Neal's show to respond to Commissioner Heiskell's comments. I hope to set the record straight, not to provoke a confrontation.

In the article Commissioner Heiskell said, "We are trying to do what David Roden wants us to do. It will take community pride to do this cleanup, not just the county. I think we are on the right track and moving forward. No one hates an eyesore more than me."

First, please note that this is not just what I want, there were over 120 people at that first meeting and this is what they want. This effort is not the work of one person. It is a group of very respectable persons who want the best for Walker County. To say it's what David Roden wants is very very wrong. I just brought it to her attention on Jan. 2015. A whole community is demanding for change and working together to do something about it. It is not one person.



Second, her comments that no one hates an eyesore more than me is very odd to me. After a year of being notified about this issue, why were the houses and the commercial building torn down after the March 1, 2016 meeting. I have looked at these homes and buildings for 15 years and all the residents on this end of the county have as well. There had been plenty of time to do something before the community rose up and demanded a change.

Third, I wish Ms. Heiskell only the best, I have nothing personal against her. But if her health is to the point that it is hindering progress of this county, let us thank her for her service to the county all these years and retire and let someone else start fresh and let's all work together to build Walker County to be the best it can be. While things have not gone 100 percent to the satisfaction of the commissioner and residents in the past, we do owe her a thank you for doing the best she could.

On a sidenote- I have been invited to attend a meeting of the Planning Commission on Thursday, April 14, at 7 p.m. at the Walker County Civic Center in Rock Springs to approve a laundry mat at the site of the old building where the tarps on the roof were. I do plan to attend and hope we can discuss if a facility that lends itself to renters who cannot afford a washer and dryer is really what is best for our community. Seems to me we should be looking for solutions on how we can attract home ownership in our neighborhoods. And if we are going to have homes or mobile homes for rent in our community, these homes should be in good working order, such as heat and air, no holes in the floors, electrical panels and switches that are exposed, windows that have jagged glass that kids can cut themselves on, and so on. Let's raise the standard of what is acceptable for our Walker County families and kids rent and not accept sub-par housing for them to live in.

I appreciate the media covering this project as the project it was intended to be- a rebirth of a community- and not a political rally or endorsement for one person for a elected position, nor a bashing of elected folks. On the other hand, if this community needs to expose and bring attention to a problem that is hurting our community, it is my opinion we should be able to meet with our elected officials and find out why things are not being done.
