

"Guitar Red" is actually Paul Johnson who has been a long Morgan Park resident. Paul attended John D. Shoop and Morgan Park High School. He is a talented multi-instrumentalist who taught himself to play guitar at the age of 14. In the late 50's, he began playing clubs such as the Apex Show Club in Robbins, IL before getting gigs at clubs in Chicago including Rumboogie, The Esquire Show Lounge, The Happy Medium, The Pump Room, and the Regal Theatre. He got the name "Guitar Red" from Lucky Cordell, a well known Chicago radio personality.

His first recording was "Red Hot Red" in 1960. His early recordings gave him plenty of opportunities to build up a career on the club scene in Chicago and by the early seventies he was working full time on the supper club circuit.



TIDBITS OF A PROUD HISTORY AND TREASURED MEMORIES OF

MORGAN PARK (1860 - 1914)

<mark>1869</mark>

The Blue Island Land and Building Company was established. The area between 107th and 109th streets was developed and incorporated as the village of Morgan Park.

<mark>1871</mark>

The Chicago Fire results in many of Chicago's business leaders and wealthy citizens seeking to move from the central city. Residences are built in the Morgan Park, Beverly Hills communities. Wealthy home owners created opportunities for employment of African Americans in domestic work.

<mark>1880</mark>

Census data identifies three African American families residing in Morgan Park:

- * F. Britten, laborer
- * J. Jates, laborer
- * C. Butler, servant

All were employed and living in household of G. Thayer, Professor at the Women's College.

<mark>1884</mark>

Two African Americans baptized at Morgan Park Baptist Church.

<mark>1885</mark>

Seven African Americans received as members in Morgan Park Baptist Church.

<mark>1891</mark>

Beth Eden Church established as independent Baptist Mission. Mr. William B. Tyler, leader of founding group.

<mark>1903</mark>

Thirty African American families identified as residents of Morgan Park.

The early families were identified as :

<mark>1903</mark>

In November 1903, African American resident, Mark Wiley, confessed to killing Police Chief George Airey (white).

James W. Payne and his wife, Hattie, were held as accomplices. Angry whites secretly posted warning signs everywhere: "To the colored population of Morgan Park: Forty-eight hours to get out."

Several families, stricken with terror, left Morgan Park taking what belongings they could. George Prentiss, Mayor of the white and black community, deputized firemen and citizens to help his 12 deputies restore order. (Daily News)

<mark>1906</mark>

Arnett AME Chapel was established under leadership of J. W. Festerman

<mark>1914</mark>

The Village of Morgan Park was annexed to City of Chicago
