Position Duties**

PRESIDENT:

1. Schedule and plan meeting dates
2. Prepare meeting agendas and conduct meetings
3. Invite speakers to meetings
4. Reserves roll offs for Spring Clean Up
5. Arranges insurance for Spring Cleanup
6. Renews registration of the association with City of Aurora
7. Renews registration of Adopt-A-Street with City of Aurora
8. Oversees "Yard of the Month" and "Holiday Lighting" contests
9. Interviews winners of contests for newsletter

VICE PRESIDENT:

1. Stands in for President if President is absent from activities
2. Completes duties as assigned by President

TREASURER:

1. Maintains association's checking account and reports to association board
2. Make deposits and writes checks
3. Collects and records payment of yearly membership dues
4. Checks mail box for renewals and communications received in mail
5. Maintains association roster

SECRETARY:

1. Takes notes at meetings
2. Prepares meeting minutes *

**Board Vacancy
Election
Process**

Most Village East Neighborhood Association (VENA) Board members are up for re-election at the October Annual Meeting.

The VENA neighborhood needs to take the following steps to replace the President, VE Editor, and any late-announced vacancies.

1. Call the outgoing President to nominate yourself or someone who has agreed to serve.
2. The President will introduce the candidates at the Annual Meeting, and invite each candidate to describe reasons for running
3. The Meeting attendees will vote, the Secretary will tally, and the President will announce the successful candidates *

Do You Have the “Write Stuff” to Be VE Update Editor?

To continue publishing the newsletter in its current style, realistically the Editor should be comfortable using Microsoft Word and writing in a newsy manner. Experience with taking and editing digital photographs is necessary as well. Additionally, a good eye for layout and design certainly is indeed appreciated by the readers.

Most residents have responded via past polls they like being kept informed by a local newsletter. Out of a neighborhood of this size, there should be someone who can carry on.

Cuts to R-Line Service Already?

After just less than 6 months of operation, the RTD Board of Directors is considering reducing service on the recently opened R Line that runs exclusively through Aurora. Despite the short time the line has been operational, the up to 2,500 new residential units planned and under construction next to the light rail line, and a connection to the Anschutz Medical Campus where 25,000 work and 1.7 M people are treated each year; RTD thinks the ridership isn't up to par and wants to cut the frequency and add unnecessary transfers to the routes. 
A Vast Village
