







Store food properly. Keep pantries, sinks, food counters clean.








2 BUILD RATS

Basement windows should fit tightly, and have no broken panes.



WRONG! RIGHT!



All openings 3/8" or wider in the foundation walls, and within 30" of the ground, should be rat-stopped with metal collars or cement.

GARBAGE IS RAT FOOD!

Be sure all garbage, rubbish, ashes in your yard is placed in containers.

Bird food should be placed on raised platforms.

RAISE STORED MATERIALS! Place lumber, pipes and other materials at least 18" off the ground WRONG RIGHT
