Resilient PHX

Phoenix is one of ten cities participating in a national Resilience AmeriCorps program funded by Cities of Service. Resilient PHX is



hosted in the Phoenix City Manager's Office to address problems associated with extreme weather and to build community resilience, self-reliance, and sustainability.

Projects include efforts to enhance and coordinate the City's participation in the county-wide Heat Relief Network, engage residents in preparedness training to foster personal and community resilience to natural hazards through the Resilience Workshops, and empower citizen volunteers to create shade in their communities.

Demonstration Projects

Grandview Message Boards: Resilient PHX funded the installation of three message boards in the Grandview Neighborhood to bridge the communication gap with lowincome and elderly residents, and renters in multi-family housing. The goal of the message boards is to share information as democratically as possible, fostering a community culture of inclusiveness and resilience. The message boards play the role of a community newsletter, and the Grandview Neighborhood Association has seen an increase in attendance and a more diverse group of attendees at meetings and neighborhood events.

Volunteer Impact and Community Resilience Workshops

Community leaders engaged in the Resilience Workshops will serve as "connectors" to other residents in their communities, helping them better access City services and support from non-profit organizations to address the program's goals of reducing the effects of extreme heat and flooding. The workshops provide information to enhance individual and community resilience, self-reliance and sustainability. Volunteers will lead projects identified and supported by connections made through the workshops, such as a tree shade project. Workshop participants are provided with a Community Leader Reference Book that will serve as a guide to the resources and services available to residents. **Get the**

During your student's four years of high school, they experience days that are packed with activities, friends and fun; but we must remember the number one goal for all our high school students: pre-paring students for higher education. We are proud to announce that Moon Valley received a preliminary school letter grade of A! One of the many reasons we received an A is our focus on college and career readiness

Why is college-readiness so important? A recent study shows that by 2020, 75% of jobs will require at least a two-year degree or higher. That compares to just 62% of jobs requiring higher education in 2009. Also, a college degree makes a big difference for lifetime earning potential. Those with only a high school diploma earn about \$1.2 million over their working lifetime. But those with a Bachelor's degree earn almost twice that, about \$2.1 million.

Here are some important things for all students to remember as they work toward their higher-education goals:

☐ Your high school transcript sticks with you for life. ☐ All students should take the PSAT during both sophomore and junior year and the Pre-ACT sophomore year as a way to prepare and practice for the ACT, which is taken, for free, during junior year.





rent pregnancy losses (repeat spontaneous abortions), and low blood platelet counts (thrombocytopenia)."She was working with U-Haul as a part-time employee but had to take a leave of absence with no pay since November of 2017 due to her medical condition. She has been relying on the assistance of AHCCCS, family, and friends. Unfortunately, the family's funds are close to exhaustion, and we are optimistic that by submitting this article for financial assistance, we can extend this to her circle of friends and supporters. Jenn has been going through extensive and painful surgeries over the past year due to uncontrollable blood clotting, she had multiple bypass surgeries called femoral artery (the main arterial supply to the leg) including the one from January of 2018. But after a few days, the bypass surgery didn't work and her left leg started dying which she had to make a difficult decision of amputation on 1/13/2018. She went through extensive rehab until she was sent home to start her new norm on 2/15/2018. After a few days of being at home, Jenn was rushed to the emergency room again due to blood clotting and on 2/24/2018; her remaining leg required a femoral artery bypass and again, was unsuccessful. On 3/8/2018, she went for another surgery for her second leg amputation. She is now recovering and trying to be strong for her family. She is adjusting to her second new norm and will be moved to rehab facility soon. Any help you can give is greatly appreciated Please click on the link to donate.

She has five kids between the ages of 26 and 13. Shelby, her oldest son, has shouldered the responsibility of home care for his mother. During the past couple months of his mom's hospitalization, he has been and continues to be the supporter of his siblings and the household burdens


