"Am I Eligible" Survey



"Am I Eligible", a new online screening tool for Louisville residents. "Am I Eligible" invites individuals to complete a brief online survey to determine which RCS programs and

services are available to them. This tool is featured on the RCS homepage

at https://louisvilleky.gov/government/resilienceand-community-services or can be accessed at https://amieligible.louisvilleky.gov/. Survey participants are asked to answer questions related to household size and monthly income: whether or not there are children present in the household; is there a disability; as well as what programs are of interest. Based on the answers to the questions, participants receive a customized list of programs and services for which they may be eligible including educational scholarships, housing and financial assistance, help starting a microbusiness, assistance with budgeting or opening a bank account, and more. "Am I Eligible" can be completed anonymously or participants have the option of submitting their name, contact information as well as selecting a Neighborhood Place most convenient for them. An RCS staff member assigned to the designated Neighborhood Place will then contact the participant by phone or email for further follow-up.
