

Proper disposal and use of trash containers

City Code requires regular trash to be placed in a bag before it is placed in a Refuse Collection container.

- » Trash: Plastic garbage bags -Trash on ground around container must be picked up by property owner and/or the occupants of the property
- » Yard Waste: biodegradable paper bags or rigid containers marked "yard waste" (tied tree branches should be no larger than 4 feet long and 2 feet wide)

City Code Section 1307.01. item B ("Acceptable Waste Collection Procedures")

"Use of Plastic Bags Alone is Prohibited. Acceptable waste generated at residential units placed into plastic bags alone shall not be considered contained as required in this title. To be in compliance with this title, all acceptable waste generated at residential units, other than bulk and

white goods, must be placed into plastic or paper bags and then disposed of in the appropriate container for the applicable collection method. Yard waste shall be placed into a lawn or leaf bag or plastic or galvanized metal containers that are no more than thirty-two (32) gallons in size and not more than fifty (50) total pounds weight with a tight fitting lid and handles."

City Code Section 1303.021, item F ("Duties of public-Storage & disposal of waste")

"Duty to Keep Collection Area Free of Debris and Spillage. It shall be the duty of the property owner and/or occupant(s) to keep the designated point of collection and the surrounding area free from debris, spillage, and other overflow pursuant to Sections 705.03 and 707.03 of the Columbus City Codes."

Yard waste must be placed in front of your home at the curb, at least 3 feet from refuse and recycling containers, fire hydrants, mailboxes or trees.

Set out yard waste before 6:00 a.m. (but no more than 12 hours prior to collection)
