### • Ingerman Group (Rodney Court Apartments)

- IG renovated Rodney Court Apartments (1100 Pennsylvania Avenue)
   17 years ago.
- One of the first buildings in Wilmington to have an elevator.
- They would like our support as they go through the application process to renovate the building (cost \$4.5m).
- o All work has to abide by standards set by the Secretary of Interior.
- Are looking for letters of support from the neighborhood. This is probably something that the CSTNA board could take care of on behalf of the entire neighborhood.

## • Parks Redesign Report

- Sarah Lester from West Side Grows.
- West Side Grows recently collaborated with the city to renovate 3
  parks across the west side. Renovations were in response to the West
  Side revitalization plan.
- o **Strategy**: went to the community to see what you all wanted.
- Funding: leveraged \$1.2m with City of Wilmington and other funding sources, including \$600k Parks & Recreation grant.
- o Completion of Father Tucker expected before the Italian Festival.
- We've been working for the better part of a year to get the wheels rolling on renovations for Tilton Park and lower Cool Spring Park.
- There will be two meetings to discuss proposed renovations to the parks:
  - Thursday, March 1 from 4:00pm 5:30pm at Lewis
     Elementary School (920 N Van Buren St)
  - Thursday, March 1 from 6:30pm 8:00pm at Mother Africa
     Union Church (812 N Franklin St)
- Designs by Ground Reconsidered (based out of Philadelphia).
- Some of the funds for park renovations will go toward storm water management.
- We're at the beginning of this process. Could be several years before completion.

### • Ingleside

Been vacant for a long time. What is going on with this building?

- Nate Durant had a conversation with Lawrence R. Cessna, President and CEO of Ingleside Homes Inc., who promised to provide CSTNA with weekly updates of the construction schedule.
- o Nate has invited him to a neighborhood meeting. We'll see...

#### Park Place

- Carol and Nate met with Mayor Purzycki in December to discuss the vacant properties on Park Place.
- We've long suspected that these homes were going to be demolished.
- According to the mayor: an LLC owns the properties; they don't like
  the way they are now; in need of major renovations to bring them up
  to code. Upon further review, the company concluded that renovation
  was cost prohibitive. Basically, they want to demolish and rebuild.
- We're a historic district. They can't just demolish. Mayor ensured us that anything they do will have to go through the neighborhood and the city's historic district design review.
- They will present to the neighborhood association at a future date.
- What is the status on taxes, mortgages? They do not owe the city any money, so the city can't really take the properties and give them to the landbank.
- Are these owners who claim that the properties are too run down to restore the same owners who have allowed these properties to deteriorate? Not sure. Heather Hook has been attempting to trace this. The properties have changed hands multiple times.
- What's the status of homeless people who are still living within the Park Place properties? Probably still there.

#### CSTNA Committees

 Nate suggests that we have enough knowledge and willpower to begin building committee structures within the neighborhood association to tackle bigger, more complicated problems. The idea was well-received.

### **Captain Campos**

- Police Updates
  - Capt. Campos is taking over for Capt. Kurten, who has moved on to Internal Affairs.
  - WPD is trying to be more transparent. Campos provided this week's CompStat (Comparative Statistics) report to the entire neighborhood association, and CompStat reports will now be available online.
  - Capt. Campos very kindly walked the neighborhood association through the CompStat report, how to read it, etc..
