INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT MARCH!

The name of March comes from *Martius*, the first month of the earliest <u>Roman calendar</u>. It was named after <u>Mars</u>, the <u>Roman god</u> of war, and an ancestor of the Roman people through his sons <u>Romulus and Remus</u>. His month *Martius* was the beginning of the season for warfare, and the <u>festivals</u> held in his honor during the month were mirrored by others in October, when the season for these activities came to a close. *Martius* remained the first month of the Roman calendar year perhaps as late as 153 BC, and several <u>religious observances</u> in the first half of the month were originally <u>new year</u>'s celebrations. Even in <u>late antiquity</u>, <u>Roman mosaics</u> picturing the months sometimes still placed March first.

<u>March 1</u> began the numbered year in Russia until the end of the 15th century. <u>Great Britain</u> and its colonies continued to use March 25 until 1752, when they finally adopted the Gregorian calendar (the fiscal year in the UK continues to begin on the 6th April, initially identical to 25 March in the former Julian calendar). Many other cultures and religions still celebrate the beginning of the New Year in March.

March is the first month of spring in the Northern Hemisphere (North America, Europe, Asia and part of Africa) and the first month of fall or autumn in the Southern Hemisphere (South America, part of Africa, and Oceania).

Ancient Roman observances celebrated in March include <u>Agonium Martiale</u>, celebrated on March 1, March 14, and March 17, <u>Matronalia</u>, celebrated on March 1, <u>Junonalia</u>, celebrated on March 7, <u>Equirria</u>, celebrated on March 14, <u>Mamuralia</u>, celebrated on either March 14 or March 15, <u>Hilaria</u> on March 15 and then through March 22–28, <u>Argei</u>, celebrated on March 16–17, <u>Liberalia</u> and <u>Bacchanalia</u>, celebrated March 17, <u>Quinquatria</u>, celebrated March 19–23, and <u>Tubilustrium</u>, celebrated March 23. These dates do not correspond to the modern <u>Gregorian calendar</u>.

WHAT IS THE TRUE MEANING OF ST. PATRICK'S DAY?



Saint Patrick's Day, or the Feast of Saint Patrick (Irish: Lá Fhéile Pádraig, "the Day of the Festival of Patrick"), is a cultural and religious celebration held on 17 March, the traditional death date of Saint Patrick (c. AD 385–461), the foremost patron saint of Ireland.

Saint Patrick's Day was made an official Christian feast day in the early 17th century and is observed by the Catholic Church, the Anglican Communion (especially the Church of Ireland), the Eastern Orthodox Church, and the Lutheran Church. The day commemorates Saint Patrick and the arrival of Christianity in Ireland, and celebrates the heritage and culture of the Irish in general. Celebrations generally involve public parades and festivals, céilís, and the wearing of green attire or shamrocks Christians who belong to liturgical denominations also attend church services and historically the Lenten restrictions on eating and drinking alcohol were lifted for the day, which has encouraged and propagated the holiday's tradition of alcohol consumption.

Saint Patrick's Day is a public holiday in the Republic of Ireland, Northern Ireland, the Canadian province of Newfoundland and Labrador (for provincial government employees), and the British Overseas Territory of Montserrat. It is also widely celebrated by the Irish diaspora around the world, especially in the United Kingdom, Canada, United States, Brazil, Argentina, Australia and New Zealand. Saint Patrick's Day is celebrated in more countries than any other national festival. Modern celebrations have been greatly influenced by those of the Irish diaspora, particularly those that developed in North America. In recent years [when?], there has been criticism of Saint Patrick's Day celebrations for having become too commercialised and for fostering negative stereotypes of the Irish people.

WINTER STORMS

Winter storms have the potential to cause power outages, flooding and traffic hazards. Plan ahead. Remove fallen leaves Help prevent street flooding by removing leaves and keeping storm drains clear. Place fallen leaves in your green waste bin, or bag your leaves and place them in your regular refuse bin. From November

to mid-January, utilize Roseville's complimentary front yard leaf pickup service.

Prepare at home:

Keep an emergency kit with a battery operated radio, flashlights, free batteries and a first-aid kit.

Stock easy-to-open prepared foods, a can opener, bottled water and pet food in case of a power outage. Keep extra blankets and warm clothes in a safe dry place. If you use an electric generator, be sure it is installed properly otherwise you put your property and utility workers lives at risk. Visit Ready.gov for more ways to prepare yourself for winter storms.

Durling a storm, stay safe:

Stay updated. Sign up for Placer Alert (formerly Roseville Alert) to be alerted about emergency events in your neighborhood. Sign up for free electronic newsletters from the City. Follow the City's social media accounts. During a storm or emergency, updates will be posted on these. We have accounts on Facebook, NextDoor and Twitter.

Power outages:

Power outages may occur during stormy weather. To report an outage or for more information about power outages, call Roseville Electric Utility at (916) 774-5428. If you live outside the City of Roseville, contact Pacific Gas & Electric (PG&E). DO NOT TOUCH downed power lines. If you see a downed power line, do not touch it. Assume it is dangerous and call 9-1-1 immediately.

Tree hazards:

To report downed trees and tree limbs, call Roseville Parks & Recreation at (916) 774-5748 during normal business hours. After hours or on weekends, call the police and fire dispatch at (916) 774-5000 x 1. Stream Levels. View real-time stream levels around Roseville.

Street flooding and road hazards:

During a storm, do not walk or drive past barricades or signs warning of flooded areas. To report localized street flooding or road hazards, call Roseville Public Works at (916) 774-5790 during a storm, do not walk or drive past barricades or signs warning of flooded areas. To report localized street flooding or road hazards, call Roseville Public Works at (916) 774-5790 during normal business hours. After hours or on weekends, call police and fire dispatch at (916) 774-5000 x 1. To report street flooding for streets located in Placer County, contact Placer County Public Works.

Sandbags:

The City only provides sandbags when creeks in Roseville are expected to reach levels that could flood homes, not just because heavy rains are predicted. To find out if the City's sandbag stations are open, call (916) 774-5790 or visit here. To have sandbag

bags readily available for your property, you may purchase sandbags from a local home improvement store.

Trails:

Trails, particularly in low-lying areas, are subject to flooding and temporary closures due to storm events. Use caution and never enter a water covered area.

Safety:

There is a natural curiosity to want to view first-hand the rising water conditions. BE SAFE. Rising water is dangerous. Stay away from the water and off levees. Pedestrians and vehicles on levees are prohibited, pose a danger to the public, and hinder the efforts of emergency response and flood monitors. Do not walk through flowing water or drive through flooded areas. Do not drive during a storm unless necessary. Turn on your headlights when it is raining. Slow down on wet streets.

These are a few of the types of actions you can take to ensure the safety of you and your family. We hope that this can help you this storm season!



DON'T BE A VICTIM OF A UTILITY SCAM



A handful of Roseville utility customers reported receiving calls from someone claiming that they were from Roseville Electric, and were on their way to disconnect their electricity due to a late payment. The callers demanded payment in the form of Money Pak card account numbers (cash gift cards) to keep the power on. This is a scam.

Any demand for payment via money wire (Western Union, MoneyGram) or in the form of Greendot/MoneyPak or other cash gift cards should be met with great skepticism, since these trans-

actions are untraceable and non-refundable. Certainly no utility company would ever demand payment in this form.

The City of Roseville's utility departments (Roseville Electric and Roseville Environmental Utilities) don't call customers to solicit payments. If you ever receive a call or visit from a live person claiming to be with Roseville utilities demanding immediate payment, it's a scam. Hang up and call utility billing at (916) 774-5300 to report the suspicious call. If someone contacts you in person claiming to be from one of the utility departments and they seem suspicious, don't let them in, and call Roseville Police immediately.

The disconnecting of power or other utilities should never come as a surprise to utility customers. The City's utility billing department employs a lengthy process to warn customers about delinquent bills, and never shuts off anyone's power or other utilities until they have mailed notices and sent several automated telephone reminders to the delinquent customer. If customers receiving an automated ("robo-call") reminder about an overdue bill want to make an immediate payment, they can select that option using their telephone, and are then transferred to the City's automated payment system. The automated system includes options for customers to listen to and verify their account information. Automated calls are generally made during regular business hours, not on weekends or holidays.

Customers who have any questions about an overdue bill notice are encouraged to call the utility billing customer service representatives at (916) 774-5300 during regular business hours to verify their account and ask for assistance.

Every Roseville Fire Department Firefighter is certified as a Paramedic or Emergency Medical Technician, and with a at least one Paramedic on every response unit, patients with even the most serious conditions can be stabilized and treated prior to being transported to a hospital. Roseville Fire Department specialty rescue teams respond to incidents involving hazardous materials, rope, and water rescue, and structural collapse.

The City of Roseville Fire Department's mission is to protect and enhance the safety and well being of residents, businesses, customers and partners. The Department received a five year accreditation through the Center for Public Safety Excellence in 2016 and in July of 2015 the Department received an ISO Public Protection Classification rating of 2.
