Behind the City Scene February 2019

We are a month into the New Year and I have been reminiscing about Aurora's important community issues. Many years ago the hot button issues were: save Fitzsimmons Army Hospital, fix the dirt medians, stop the Stapleton airport over flights, City and County of Aurora, the "blue line" limit on Aurora's future boundaries, a new City Hall yes or no, the pit bull ban, a proposed E. Jewell Ave. bridge over I-225, when would I-225 extend beyond E. Iliff and Dave Perry at the Aurora Sentinel.

Fast forward decades later to some of today's big issues and challenges: ethics rules for elected officials, registration of lobbyists, location of oil and gas facilities, traffic congestion, affordable housing, homelessness, City Council monetary donation campaign limits reform, a pedestrian bridge at the former Regatta Plaza and Dave Perry at the Aurora Sentinel.

Other situations and issues remain consistent through the ages as reflected by the constituent's interaction with me: Code Enforcement – too little or too much, crime, the maintenance of our roads – prudent funding or pay now or pay way more later, multi-family housing, group homes in single family communities, speeding in our neighborhoods.

Under our form of municipal government the City Manager is responsible for the provision of City services. I have been very impressed with our relatively new City Manager Jim Twombly. He is diligently getting to know the pulse of our City. Will the strong "political winds" at the Federal and State levels of government impact our municipal election in November? We are 10 months away from our next Mayoral race and we are already seeing several folks expressing interest in running. This is amazing to me since we, unlike Denver, are not a strong Mayor form of government. It is an honor to serve as your Ward IV Council Member as we move our City forward.

Meet Your Neighbor

Meet Arnie Schultz, long-time Village East resident and Aurora volunteer, activist, and community leader. Arnie's going on 23 years as a member of the VENA Board, so we thought it was a good time to sit down and ask him a few questions about what he loves and remembers about the neighborhood.

Coming to Village East


Arnie and family moved to Aurora from the Chicago area in 1975 after spending a year in Denver. They were attracted to Village East because of its proximity to the VA hospital, where Arnie worked or 32 years, and inclusion in the Cherry Creek School district. His kids ended up attending (and loving) Village East Elementary, Prairie Middle School, and Overland High School.

A Young Neighborhood

Village East was much smaller when Arnie moved in. Fewer than half the houses between Mississippi, Florida, Havana, and Peoria existed. Canterbury Park was a favorite for the neighborhood children with its Cinderella Pumpkin Coach. Mississippi Ave. was a one-lane road in each direction with a bike path and turned into a dirt road at Chambers. City Hall was down the street in the Bella Vita Building (E. Florida Ave. and S. Joliet St.). The big regional draw was the Buckingham Mall (now the Gardens on Havana), which hosted events like car shows, scout rallies, concerts, and dog shows in its courtyard every weekend.

VENA Is Reborn

In 1988, plans were drawn to widen Florida Ave. into a four-lane road and have it cross Havana. The VENA meeting considering the proposal attracted 300 neighbors to protest the plan. The effort galvanized Village East residents, who shortly thereafter reformed the Village East Neighborhood Association (VENA). Arnie has been on the board since 1994 and has helped with many efforts to retain the neighborhood's character as a quiet, pleasant place to live.

A Life in Service

Arnie has always given back to the community, as a band booster for Overland High; as a Scout leader; as a member of countless boards, committees, and organizations; as a political campaigner; and now as founder of his non-profit, Recreational Opportunities for Aurora Residents (ROAR), dedicated to providing young Aurora residents access to recreation facilities and classes throughout the city. And he's not alone---Arnie shared that Village East has always been home to civic-minded residents, including City Council members, State legislators, political activists, and even a former mayor.

A Changing Neighborhood

Though much about Village East has stayed the same (many of Arnie's original neighbors are still in residence, and the original owner of his house actually stopped by recently for a visit), he's enjoyed watching the neighborhood change over the years. He's taken by the neighborhood's growth and all the traffic and density that comes with it, but has enjoyed how the demographics have changed over the years as well. According to Arnie, Village East's central location and dedicated residents make it a great place to live, and he has no plans to leave.
