Burglary Prevention

There has been an increase in burglaries in your neighborhood. The following tips can help you avoid becoming the next burglary victim. Locking your windows and doors, installing high security locks, and establishing good security lighting, are the easiest and most cost-effective ways to prevent burglary. Here are some additional ways to deter burglaries:

- Ensure you are using solid exterior doors and that the doors are properly installed.

 Adequately anchor the strike plate to the framing of the house by using 3" long screws.
- Use solid wood or metal exterior doors. NEVER use an interior door to secure your

home. They are flimsy and not as strong as exterior doors.

 Install weather stripping around your doors if the doors do not fit tightly.

- Every exterior door should be equipped with a deadbolt lock. Only using key-inthe-knob locks is insufficient.
- Make sure you use a deadbolt lock AND a knob lock every time you leave your home!
- Use a blocking device on all sliding or patio doors. A broomstick or dowel placed in the inside track can help prevent sliding door break-ins.
- Never hide a key outside of your home. Leave a spare key with a trusted neighbor.
- I ock all windows and sure them up with a blocking device (Dowels or broomsticks).
- Always leave a light on when you are not home, giving the appearance that someone is actually home.
- Increase your exterior lighting and use motion lights and/or timers.
- Pick up trash from your yard and alley ways.
- Make sure that you collect your trash and recycling bins from the road after pick up days.
 Leaving trash cans out for several days' signals to burglars that someone may be out of town.
- Trim trees and bushes to ensure that windows and doors are not blocked
- Landscaping should be trimmed so criminals cannot use it for concealment.
- Use "Beware of Dog" or "Alarm" decals to deter suspects from entering your home.
- Consider purchasing an alarm system!
- Pick up newspapers from your yard every day and get your mail daily. If you go on vacation have a trusted neighbor of triche do tris to you.
- Use safes to store valuables and ALWAYS keep a record of your serial numbers.
- Whenever you move into a new home or aparament, always change the locks!


