  - a. Tom wasn't able to be here, but Larry Finnicum (Dir. Of Operations) speaking with an engineer from Suez
    - i. 5 year commitment to replacing the water mains in Ashbourne Hills and Radnor Green
    - ii. Pipes were installed in the 1950's and need to be replaced
    - iii. Material is cast iron without a cement liner- occasionally leads to reddish brown rusty water
    - iv. Last year there was a total of five projects approx \$4MM
    - v. This year projects invested to \$2.2MM
  - b. Ted Harris (engineer) to discuss the succession of projects through the neighborhood
    - i. See handouts- including sequence of events
    - ii. Modernizing the mains to avoid the discoloration of water that occurs with direct contact of the metal with the water
    - iii. 5 year time frame was the plan at the beginning of 2018.

    - v. Current work is focused on activating the newly installed mains
      - 1. Hope is to be done with the current projects by the end of Avon
