How can you help?

Chairperson and Committee person/s duties:

- 1. Keep in contact with board members and newsletter editor, with the dates and times of events and activities being planned.
- 2. Keep list of residents emails, and phone numbers that may be interested in helping with events, groups or activities.
- 3. Keep a folder with information about committee, what was done to organize event; your contacts, supplies, prizes, refreshments needed, etc.
- 4. Keep receipts of items purchased for events or activities. Contact treasurer for reimbursement of any expenses.
 - <u>NCC Representative</u> Northland Com. Council representative attends one meeting/month to keep our membership in the Council for voting rights of area news from City of Columbus. 1st Tuesday of each month an alternate is needed to take turns attending meetings. The mission of the NCC is to represent and communicate the interests of the residents and member organizations to government officials, councils and boards.
 - Northland Com. Council Development Committee Representative attends one meeting/ month to keep our membership in the council and for voting rights for issues in our area. Need 2 representatives to take turns attending meetings on the last Wednesday of each month.
 - <u>Board Members</u> President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer NEW LEADERS NEEDED we can show you how!
 - <u>Area Representative</u> Deliver newsletters for area, distribute membership forms & collect dues, keep in contact with board members, such as Welcome Committee, Blockwatch, and attend general BWCA meetings.
 - Beautification Committee (1-4 persons) Organize clean-up events, landscape awards, contests, entrance sign up-keep.
 - <u>Garage Sale</u> (1-2 persons) Collect information of participants in garage sale. Provide balloons for mailboxes. Place ad in local papers or on-line. Put up and take down signs for the event. Provide event dates to Newsletter Editor to give residents a deadline to participate and who to contact.
 - Membership Drive (1-2 persons) Help with Membership Drive by canvassing neighborhood for final collection at End Date.
 - <u>Welcoming</u> (1-2 persons) Put together a list of area information to give to new residents. (Include: coupons, discounts, business cards or menus for area restaurants, etc.) Make an Information Packet with these items that you have collected. Update and organize information each year to put in the Welcome Information Packet. Keep in contact with Area Reps to Welcome new residents. Or create a crafty idea to give to new residents!
 - <u>Social Committee</u> (1-2 persons) Contact residents who are interested in starting clubs and groups, and help arrange meetings and get-togethers for groups. Keep list of group contact person, and report info to newsletter editor with meeting dates, etc. Organize an annual community picnic or party. Help with organizing Holiday events, like 4th of July parade, Caroling, Breakfast With Santa, etc.
 - National Night Out Event (1-2 persons) Volunteers needed to arrange a fun event in our neighborhood, held the first Tuesday of August. The event is meant to increase awareness about police programs in communities, such as drug prevention, neighborhood watch, and other anti-crime efforts. www.nationalnightout.org
 - <u>Block Watch</u> Organize & meet with group of neighborhood residents who will watch for criminal & suspicious behavior. Work with CPD Community Liaison Officers about speaking at our Block-Watch, Community Civic Association, groups/organizations regarding crime issues. *Block watches are a proven means of reducing burglary and other crimes*. *Use these on-line* resources: www.crimereports.com; http://www.ncpc.org; https://www.columbus.gov/police/; communitycrimemap.com


About Our "Civic Association"
