Captain Dan Engrine, Northwest Captain - Chief Deputy, PJ Smith, FWPD

- o Captain Dan Engrine reported:
 - 3 newbies
 - 3 officers on street were lateral
 - 36 going through basics for Police Training
 - Staffing is strong currently
 - Full time officers are 479 presently with hopes of going up to 500
 - A couple of officers left recently
- o NW Quadrant crime is down 7.5%
- Stealing cars up 3% because of joy riding from younger groups
 - Mainly taking Honda's and Kia's because can use a flash or zip drive to start them
- Food Truck stolen from Shell station at Tonkel and Clinton
 - Owner wasn't happy with response of finding his truck from county, so he has moved to Florida

Mark Salomon & Dana Christie - Neighborhood Code Compliance

- o Dana Christie shared with us:
 - Total tall grass and weed inspections to date were 6500+
 - Had Total Inspections from October 19 to November 18, 2022, of 400
 - Residential inspections: 154
 - Workplan reviews and inspections: 12
 - Residential hearing inspections: 39
 - Order inspections: 95
 - Condemned and vacated structure inspections: 92
 - Commercial inspections: 32
 - Inoperable or abandoned vehicle inspections: 82
 - Order to demolish inspections: 0
 - Monitor inspections: 0
 - Still taking care of Leaf Pick Up
 - Can call 311 if in bags for pickup

Tom Didier, City Council (or Russ Jehl)

- Russ Jehl shared the following:
 - Homeowners apply for permits to build a fence or patio and City approves, it is up to homeowner to share that info with Association
 - Association Covidence will overrule the city
 - There is a disclaimer coming with the permits now
 - Must have a work permit for building from city
 - City Council passed some funds to improve small business (Non-Profit Org)

- o If business were closed because of COVID city has funds and they must be used but businesses have to apply for funds
 - Have not seen applications from small business yet
- o Federal Funds have offset shortfalls such as streets, sidewalks
 - Tourism was given largest amount of funds
- Federal Government gave us: 52 Million for City, 70 Million for County, 50 Million for School Systems
 - Over a trillion dollars

Dan Baisden – Administrator of Neighborhood Planning & Activation

- President's Meeting is December 5th at 6pm at Citizen Square
- There are 39 Neighborhood Improvement Grants completed except for 1
- 2023 Neighborhood Grants and will start seeing info Next Month
 - o Neighborhood can get a grant again
 - Drainage could possibly be covered because of health or beautification for Neighborhood

Ken Fries shared the following with us:

- In Ft Wayne we have had 21 homicides and 17 have been solved by using Crime Stoppers
 - In Fort Wayne Homicide Police Officers have a good relationship with Neighborhoods which attributes to reason 80% are resolved
- Crime Stoppers only pay on Felony
 - It is an anonymous program, no names, no addresses shared
- Crime Stoppers is civilian organized, privately funded
 - His salary only is paid by City
 - 1983 in Indiana
 - 1967 in New Mexico
- Free Tip and Private App (P3 App)

- ken@crimestoppersfw.org
- Drugs are biggest crime
 - People steal for Drugs not Food
- Doesn't think MJ should be legalized because it is a gateway to bigger drugs
- Mental Illness is a big problem
 - People need not be put in jail but into a network or program that can help with mental illness
- Share good tips with police
- Crime Stoppers need feedback from other agencies
- When Crime Stoppers gets a legitimate call, the person receives his payout on Friday
 - 2 Board Members Go to meet the person where they want to meet, no names
 - Cash is given to that person, and everyone leaves

This was very interesting speaker and subject. Ken Fries is a great person as well as speaker.
