SEALCOAT – Scheduled for the following dates:

- Wednesday, June 21st for the Red Section
- Monday, June 26th for the Yellow Section

STRIPING/PAVEMENT MARKINGS – Scheduled for the following dates:

- Tuesday, June 20th for the Blue Section
- Thursday, June 22nd for the Red Section
- Tuesday, June 27th for the Yellow Section

Please be sure to have all vehicles and obstructions out of the work area on the dates listed above, or it may result in having to reschedule.

A FEW OTHER THINGS OF NOTE:

Outside watering should not be done on the day we are in your area. All sprinklers must be turned off and trash/recycle containers must be removed, or services rescheduled. Auto, foot, pet, and bicycle traffic must stay off the new Sealcoat approximately 24 hours or until the barricades are removed. Failure to do so may result in damage to cars, shoes, sidewalks, carpets, etc. Sunland Asphalt will not be responsible for any damages due to a resident moving traffic control devices or driving through wet sealcoat. Do not park where work will be performed or where it blocks traffic. Keep children and pets away from the construction for their own safety.

Asphalt work cannot be applied in wind or rain, or if the weather is too cold. If any rescheduling needs to be done, you will be notified.

We understand there may be some inconvenience involved in this project, but if we work together, we can keep it to a minimum and come out with excellent results.

Sunland recommends that you have a tow truck on site to relocate vehicles should you have vehicles still on site when work is scheduled to start to avoid any possible delays which would result in a change order to you. In the event that a tow truck is needed and not on site, Sunland reserves the right to contact a provider and will increase the contract value to cover these charges at \$65/vehicle
