

Historical Highlight

HISTORIC PRESERVATION: AN EFFORT WE CAN
CONTRIBUTE TOWARDS, STONE BY STONE

Take a moment to go back in time and travel back to the beginnings of our neighborhood in 1927! The area that is now considered the Jefferson Neighborhood started off as Woodlawn Park. Woodlawn Park had a grand entrance off of W. Woodlawn Avenue that was across the street from the neighborhood's namesake – Woodlawn Lake.

Elaborate stone walls adorned the iconic entrance to the neighborhood while similar monuments at the end of each block along Lake Boulevard between W. Mistletoe Avenue and north to W. Gramercy Place stood as gateways to the new subdivision.

Unfortunately, due to automobile accidents and neglect, they are founding pieces of our neighborhood that have slowly disappeared.

According to a May 2005 article in the San Antonio Express News, the City of San Antonio and the San Antonio Conservation Society collaborated on a \$50,000 project and promoted the reversal of decades of disrepair and decline of the monuments. All of the monuments were straightened up and given a new base to prevent them from tilting.


Baltazar Espinosa, a stonemason who specialized in historic preservation work, handpicked rock from companies that sell stone material so that the reconstructed sections could closely match the original material.

In June 2021, three of the stone monuments were struck along W. Mulberry Avenue and W. Huisache Avenue. After those stone monuments were knocked over, Public Works picked up the remaining pieces and supposedly put them in storage for the day the monuments would be reconstructed. More of the connections to our neighborhood's beginnings were swept up and put away.

Now that we have new leadership who cares about our neighborhoods, could these special elements of our neighborhood be repaired? Could posts be stood up to protect these monuments? There are other similar stone planter boxes and even a bus stop (Hildebrand and Fredericksburg Road) that are in need of similar attention in our neighborhood.


If you believe in cultural and historic preservation, please help advocate for the repair of these special parts of our neighborhood that provide charm and elegance so we can celebrate their connection to our neighborhood's beginnings as those monuments will turn 100 years old in four years. These monuments transcend time and inspire us to celebrate the past and look forward to our future through preservation.


