
CHANNEL ROCK ALERT!!

Please use great caution when docking your boat! Water is cloudy & hard to see the channel rocks that may have fallen into the canal. As in the past couple years...the rock slope under docks, put in place to stop the wall from collapsing, has shifted again. Some have fallen into the channel, creating a navigation hazard. When approaching the docks. Drive slowly and raise

When approaching the docks, Drive slowly and raise your propeller, especially inboards, while lake water is still very cloudy. We are waiting for the water to clear so we can see the boulders. We will not be removing all of the rocks, only immediate hazards!

This means pushing the rock under the dock, pushing it into the mud bottom, or removing it. Otherwise, the wall will shift and even more rocks could roll into the channel.

REMEMBER: If you are moving please leave the key fob to the new occupants!

REFUSE: In case you are unaware... since January, we have been dealing/working with, the city of Canandaigua with our Waste Management & Recycling. Hopefully... The following several pages should help you realize, we ALL need to pay attention to our dumpsters & sorting. It's VERY IMPORTANT!!it could cost us lots of money\$\$\$\$\$ if we don't!

HOLIDAY HARBOUR (Ward 3) RECYCLING

CITY PICK UP Now Every Other Week.
Please place in OUR RECYCE DUMPSTERS ONLY
(OUTSIDERS & VIOLATORS: CAMERA's are watching!)

Acceptable Recyclable Material

- •Plastics: #1 to #7: All PLASTIC bottles, jars, jugs. buckets, tubs, toys, food Pkg.
- Metal: Metal and bi-metal cans, empty aerosol cans, aluminum beverage cans, aluminum foil and foil trays
- •Glass: Clear and colored glass
- •Paper Products: Office paper, Paperbacks, Telephone books Junk mail, catalogs, Magazines, Brown paper bags, Envelopes, File folders, Construction and notebook paper, Post it notes, Non-metallic gift wrap, white & colored paper bags
- •Paperboard: All boxes that are not corrugated such as cereal, gift boxes, cake mixes, crackers, frozen food boxes. No wax coated or food stained boxes
- •Corrugated Cardboard: Remove staples, flatten and reduce to 2' by 4 ft max. No food or oil stained cardboard
- •Newspapers: Clean newspapers only

What Can NOT Be Recycled?

#1 DO NOT PUT YOUT RECYCLABLES IN A PLASTIC BAG!!!!

- •NO Plastic bags or wrapping (some grocery stores accept plastic bags for recycling)
- •Window glass, mirrors, light bulbs, dishes, Pyrex, ceramics, no flower pots
- ·Paper towels, facial tissues,
- hard-cover books,
- 3-ring/spiral notebooks,
- pizza-box bottoms
- Scrap metal, pots, pans
- Clothing/textiles
- Styrofoam (including egg cartons)
- •Electronics, batteries, VCR tapes, CD/DVDs

A final note from the editor on Garbage...

When heading to the dumpsters...Please take just "2 or 3" more steps & use the back of the dumpsters (It'll help your Fitbit totals:)

Please don't throw your garbage over the fence, hoping it goes in dumpster...really? (yes, it really does happen!)

LET'S TALK REFUSE & RECYCLING

This past winter, Holiday Harbour was "shocked" by a letter sent from the Canandaigua City Manager, John D Goodwin on January 12, 2023:

"The City's solid waste collection ordinance has for many years limited the collection of garbage, rubbish, garden and yard waste and recyclables to single-family dwellings and two to four family dwellings. It excludes commercial waste, industrial waste, trade waste, hazardous household waste, building waste or waste from multiple dwellings, or mixed-use properties with a primary commercial use. Nevertheless, we found there were various inconsistencies that had developed over the years related to our solid waste collection program and did not comply with this local law. As such, we decided that we would address those inconsistencies while making changes to our solid waste collection program overall to ensure that the City was following the ordinance and treating all properties fairly.

For example, there are several large apartment complexes of similar nature to Holiday Harbour such as Reserve Point apartments on Parrish Street, Garden View Apartments on Bristol Street, Camelot Square Apartments, Chosen Spot Apartments, The Pines Apartment on Buffalo Street that the City has not and does not collect from. This change to condominiums is consistent with not collecting from those larger complexes. Holiday Harbour (155 units), Brigham Hall (31 units) and Hotel Canandaigua (44 units on the 4th and 5th floor) are the condominium complexes within the City and none of these condominiums will receive City solid waste collection service (Hotel Canandaigua never received service). All properties with more than four units are not part of the City solid waste collection program and the condominium complexes should have not received this service from the City previously. "

After letters & emails, attendance at city meetings by both homeowners and HH board members.... with the support of the Mayor & the City Council, they voted to continue these services for us.

WE MUST BE MUCH MORE VIGILANT ABOUT THE CONTENTS OF OUR GARBAGE, Solid Waste & RECYCLING.

Or the alternative will be... private services, which of course will impact us greatly, financially!

This is the letter of thanks from our HHBR President, Claudia Schaefer, To The City of Canandaigua:

Dear Mayor Palumbo and City Council Members,

On behalf of the Holiday Board of Managers and all our Residents, I would like to thank you for your consideration in the matter of continued Refuse Service for our community. As stated at the Planning Meeting, we take our responsibility of compliance very seriously and look forward to having this valuable service continue. We have taken the following steps to ensure our continued compliance:

- 1) We have communicated to our entire community the requirement that only "household garbage" may be placed in our dumpsters. No construction material, furniture, rugs, etc., are permissible. We have signage on all entrances and on the dumpsters stating the same.
- 2) We have installed a padlock on our Maintenance gates to deter outside contractors from illegally dumping. Gates are locked all weekends and daily from 4:30 pm- 7:30 am.
- 3) We are checking the dumpsters frequently and monitoring the entire maintenance yard with our camera system.
- 4). We are planning to install a key system for "resident only" admission to the maintenance area. In addition, we are installing motion sensor lighting and closing off open access.
- 5). The Board has decided to close off one dumpster for the winter season when there are fewer residents in our community. This way only two dumpsters will need to be emptied during that time.
- 6) We will continue to ensure the maintenance yard is clear and accessible for efficient refuse collection by the City' We ask that with these efforts and improvements, you will continue to service Holiday Harbour in your waste management plan, as you always have. We appreciate your consideration and support in this matter.

HOLIDAY COLLECTION SCHEDULE: If a holiday occurs Monday-Thursday, refuse, and/or recycling and yard waste will be collected one day later than the normally scheduled collection day. For example, if the holiday falls on Monday; Monday collection will be Tuesday, Tuesday will be Weds., Weds. will be Thursday and Thursday will be Friday.

The exception is Thanksgiving week when we pickup Wards 1 & 2 on Weds.

YARD WASTE COLLECTION: From March to December yard waste is collected every other week on your regular trash day. There will be NO yard waste collection during the months of January and February.
