Please feel free to vote once you're satisfied with the discussion. Remember, you may always propose an amendment to the motion (ex: I move to amend the motion by increasing the dollar amount from \$1000 to \$1500). A second is always required just as with a main motion. You may also move to amend the amendment (ex: I move to amend the amendment by increasing the dollar amount from \$1500 to \$2000). As a general rule, once a motion or amendment is seconded, the President will ask for relevant discussion on the motion.
