#### Franklin School 1921 - 2015

## The School was used as Kindergarten through the eighth grade.

The smaller grades started on the Archer Street side and then it made a circle with the 8<sup>th</sup> grade being in the back facing Jessie Street.

I graduated in the early 50's from the 8<sup>th</sup> grade. Some years later it became a Junior High. Not sure when the school was closed.

After the school was closed, it was used and owned by the Federal Government for the US Marine Corps as a training office.

The last use was to the Fort Wayne Police Department for training.

In 2014, after being vacant, the City of Fort Wayne requested to take ownership of the property. To demolish the school and make it into a neighborhood park.

Also, the small building with garage doors was added later. It will be the only structure standing after the demolition is complete.










This is the back entrance arch before and after demolition. The Design is hoping to save the arches to be part of the new park.


