

HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION PROGRAM IS EXPANDED

Through a plan sought by Governor Ted Strickland, all seniors over the age of 65 and anyone permanently disabled will be eligible for the **NEW Homestead Exemption Program** regardless of your income level. In the past the program only applied to those mentioned who did not exceed the \$26,200 income cap. Now, the program offers a flat \$25,000.00 exemption off the market value of your home. What this means is that if you are 65 or older or permanently disabled and you file the necessary paperwork, you will only have to pay property taxes on, for example, \$75,000.00 on a home valued at \$100,000.00. Average savings are around \$400 a year. That's a lot of money!

The exemption starts with property tax bills payable in 2008. If you qualify for this exemption, you **MUST** file the attached form by **October 1, 2007** with the Franklin County Auditor. This means it needs to be in the auditor's office on or before this date. All of the information is provided on the form.
