
What? Easter Egg Hunt

The Molkery

Inquiries about Molkery use continue. Joan Wilson of Hands on Denver, the tenants in the Molkery, has been trying to respond to those who have already expressed interest. Some of the outstanding issues have been resolved. The budget and permit office has come out with "pilot" forms, fees and policies for facility rentals. These are standard for use of all city facilities so some of the amenities and fees do not apply to Molkery use but everyone uses the same form regardless. Non-profits and special groups can apply for a reduced use fee. One must apply at least two weeks ahead of time. There appears to be a reservation fee

and then an hourly rate for rental. The Molkery is not generally staffed at night so evening users need to pay for someone to be present. The minimum cost would be the overseer's salary. You may call Joan Wilson for more information at 303 331-4040. On February 2nd, Denver Parks and Recreation, in cooperation with others including HMCAI, was honored for receiving the Stephen Hart award from the State Historical Society in "recognition of outstanding achievement in preserving Colorado's cultural heritage" through its fine restoration of the Molkery.

HMCAI Pays Tribute to Dan Oredson by Veronica Dolan

We're both happy and sad as we extend happy 90th birthday greetings to Dan Oredson with one breath, and bid him a fond farewell with the next. He's leaving us to relocate in Longmont, to be near his son and his family.

We hate to see him go. Dan's been a Montclair resident for more than a quarter of a century, a considerate neighbor, an HMCAI board member for a couple of decades, a past co-president (with his late wife, Virginia) of HMCAI, and one of our hardest working, most dedicated volunteers. Among his association duties: revamping our by-laws, taking attendance at meetings, delivering the October newsletter, helping to sign up members at the July 4th picnic (even supplying the table and chairs) and hosting board meetings for years at his home when the Molkery was unavailable. He even willingly volunteered for the unglamorous job of setting up and putting back chairs and tables when we held meetings at St. Luke's.

Dan Oredson is a member of what Tom Brokaw calls "The Greatest Generation." He was born on February 17, 1915 in North Dakota and grew up in Wahkon and Minneapolis, Minnesota. He says it seems like all his life he had some sort of job. During high school he delivered newspapers and caddied, then studied credit management at the University of Minnesota. He was credit manager for a steel products company in December 1941 when the Japanese bombed Pearl Harbor and he enlisted in the Air Force. He was sent to navigation school.

Dan was navigator on B-17s in the 301st Bomb Group, 53rd Squadron, the 12th Air Force in North Africa. He flew 50 missions from there, all but ten or twelve over Europe. The 301st was awarded two Presidential Unit Citations, among other honors.

After completing his 50 combat missions, Dan taught aspects of navigation to the Free French, in Oran, Algeria, and later, when transferred to Pueblo, Colorado, he taught on the flight line where they were flying B-24s and there taught the Free Chinese. He was later transferred to Guam, where he flew another five missions, and after returning to the States he ran the navigation school at Pueblo.

After the war he married Virginia Beverly of Denver and began his career in sales, from which he retired in 1991. He was in the Air Force Reserve and was appointed Liaison Officer for the Air Force Academy, a job he held for eleven years. He also served as secretary for the 301st Bomb Group/Wings Association and has been an active volunteer for Wings Over the Rockies Museum at Lowry, where his story is available for sale at the gift shop.

The HMCAI board wishes Dan a happy life in Longmont and thanks him for his many contributions over the years to our neighborhood.

Milestones

The neighborhood recently lost two longtime residents, Carmen Anderson and James Giardini, and HMCAI board member Katy Saunders lost her dad, Bob Sweeney of Phoenix, AZ. We extend our condolences to their families.

Carmen Anderson lived for more than 50 years in the home she and her late husband built on Olive Street. She was active at St. James where she founded The Third Age Club for seniors. She led that organization from 1986 through 2002, organizing social and recreational activities for those 50 and over. She also launched an exercise program for seniors and founded the Share Program to provide groceries at wholesale prices for parishioners with limited incomes.

James Giardini, 80, died January 11th. He spent his life competing in and teaching roller figure skating,

which he loved dearly. He is survived by his wife of 53 years, Doris, a son and two grandchildren. Memorials may be made in his name to World Roller Figure Skating Team Fund, 4730 S. St., Lincoln, NE 68506.

Bob Sweeney died last December 23rd in Phoenix. He is survived by his wife and three daughters, Katy, Ann Marie and Meaghan, his parents, longtime residents of Evergreen, CO, and three brothers and a sister who live in the Denver area. A regional sales manager for Weathershield Windows, he loved flying, fishing and hunting.
