Board Report

BUDGET

The Budget for 2007 was mailed on October 12, 2006. The vote to approve this budget will be held on November 15, 2006 by the Certificate Holders. Nelson French and the Finance Committee, along with Board members, ask for your approval. This year we were able to have conference calls, with a speaker phone, so members on vacation or in their northern homes could participate in the Financial and Board meetings. It is also legal to confer by E-Mail. However all business must be presented for approval at a called Board meeting.

PLEASE READ THIS IMPORTANT INFORMATION FROM BOARD SECRETARY ED MOSAKOWSKI:

ATTENTION MAROA VOTERS:

The <u>PROXY INSTRUCTIONS</u> for <u>Form 601</u> that you received in the mail may cause some confusion. Perhaps these directions will help:

On Form 602, Section 1 c) — on the line identified as [B].

- 1) If you want the Secretary to cast your vote for you, leave the line stating "PRINT NAME of PROXY HOLDER" empty.
- 2) If you want another person to cast your vote for you, print their name on the line "PRINT NAME of PROXY HOLDER".
 - 3) DO NOT enter your name on this line.
- 4) Enter your lot/space number on the Line [SN]. You can find your lot/space number on the mailing label of the envelope you received.

<u>SECTION 3</u> — Enter your vote as you want it cast. Answer all questions. <u>If you leave the question(s) blank, no vote will be cast.</u>

<u>SECTION 4</u> — <u>Sign your name</u>; <u>enter your MAROA address and date</u>. Return the proxy by the deadline date and time to the Americana Cove Office.

UNLICENSED and UNINSURED WORKERS

I wanted to bring to your attention, as a resident, if you are using unlicensed and/or uninsured workers for air conditioning or electrical repairs, you may be putting yourself at risk financially for any loss or damage that may occur. You could have a fire or other damage to your home and YOU would be the one held responsible. If you are not carrying liability insurance you are at risk financially if any person(s) is injured on your premises. This could sometimes result in thousands of dollars! ALWAYS ask if the person you want to hire is licensed and insured. It could save you lots of money and distress in the long run!

UNATTENDED FISHING LINES

There are still fishing lines being unattended. This is a hazard to both wildlife and boaters. Please BE CONSIDERATE of others and take your fishing poles and lines in when you are through fishing. Thank you.







Veteran's Day, Remembrance Day and Armistice Day

In 1918, on the <u>eleventh hour</u> of the <u>eleventh day</u> in the <u>eleventh month</u>, the world rejoiced and celebrated. After four years of bitter war, an armistice was signed. The "war to end all wars" was over. In 1921, an unknown World War I American soldier was buried in Arlington National Cemetery. Similar ceremonies occurred earlier in England and France, where an unknown soldier was buried in each nation's highest place of honor (in England, Westminster Abbey; in France, the Arc de Triomphe). These memorial gestures all took place on November 11, giving universal recognition to the celebrated ending of World War I fighting at 11 a.m. Armistice Day officially received its name in America in 1926 through a Congressional resolution. It became a national holiday 12 years later by similar Congressional action. If the idealistic hope had been realized that World War I was "the War to end all Wars," November 11 might still be called Armistice Day. But only a few years after the holiday was proclaimed, war broke out in Europe.

Realizing that peace was equally preserved by veterans of WW II and Korea, Congress was requested to make this day an occasion to honor those who have served America in all wars. In 1954 President Eisenhower signed a bill proclaiming November 11 as Veterans Day. A law passed in 1968 changed the national commemoration of Veterans Day to the fourth Monday in October. It soon became apparent, however, that November 11 was a date of historic significance to many Americans. Therefore, in 1978 Congress returned the observance to its traditional date.






