## **RECIPE OF THE MONTH:** Shirley Bray – This is a breakfast-brunch dish: ...over...

### **Cornbread-Sausage Apple Pie**

- 1 lb. bulk sausage
- 1 Tablespoon vegetable oil
- 1 3/4 cups cornbread mix
- 1 egg, beaten
- 1 1/2 cups buttermilk (reg. milk will also work)
- 1 (21 oz) can apple pie filling
- 1 Tablespoon sugar
- 1/8 Teaspoon ground cinnamon

Cook sausage over medium heat until browned, drain well, crumble and set aside. Place vegetable oil in a 10-inch cast iron skillet; heat skillet in oven at 400 degrees for 5 minutes or until very hot.

Combine cornbread mix, egg and buttermilk in large mixing bowl; stir until smooth. Stir in sausage. Pour into heated skillet; bake at 400 degrees for 25 to 30 minutes. When done, remove cooked skillet mixture from oven and spread top with the following Filling Topper recipe below. Return to oven and cook for 5 minutes. Let stand for a couple of minutes, slice like a pie and serve.

While your skillet mixture is baking, make the Filling Topper:

Place pie filling, sugar and cinnamon in a small saucepan; cook over low heat stirring until sugar is dissolved. ... Thanks Shirley!

Keep in mind, you are not applying for Medicare! You are deciding among 16 private insurance companies offering plans that will cover only your prescription drugs or six private insurance companies with plans that will cover all your medical needs: doctors, hospitals, drugs in one managed-care company.

Do your homework! You have the time with a deadline of May 15<sup>th</sup> 2006. Don't get caught off guard, throwing up your hands or worrying won't fix the problem. So, take a deep breath and start whittling down your choices. There's plenty of help offered, even through our own neighborhood association.

TIP: Here is what you will need = Check off

- 1. Your red, white and blue Medicare card.
- 2. Listing of all prescriptions/doses,etc.
- 3. Annual bill for your prescriptions.
- 4. Preferred drug store.
- 5. If you prefer mail delivery.
- 6. Preference of 30-day or 90-day supply.
- 7. When you plan to be away or out of state.
- 8. Zip code.
