The Budget Questions Q. Where's the money going?

A. A copy of the budget was passed out on Jan. 20, 2005 @ the annual meeting. It will also be available on the website soon. The C&R states that the main purpose of the assessment (dues) is for the maintenance and improvement of the Common Areas. There are also utilities, legal fees, postage & printing costs, insurance and taxes. We promise to be good stewards of the money. We will keep you informed of our actions and progress. We are a non-profit organization. We volunteerd for this job to help protect our investment and yours!

Q. Why is Lawn Service so expensive?

A. First, an understanding of what all is involved. It's just not the front entrance! The area being serviced by Almost Heaven Lawn Care also includes the islands and easements found in our community. Year round services include: mowing, edging, trim bushes & trees, clean-up, aeration, seeding, fertilizing, weed control, seasonal replacement of flowers, replacement of pine straw and leaf removal. Our estimated (2005 budget) cost of \$135 per week covers the above mentioned.

KID HIT ON THAMES PLACE

Did this get your attention? Well, this could be a headline in the future if the residents and guests do not **SLOW DOWN**. We all have places to go and we all want to get back home as quickly as possible. But the few seconds gained by traveling faster than 20mph are not worth it. Traveling in our neighborhood to your home (average distance ½ miles):

1/2 mile @ 20mph will take 1.5 minutes
1/2 mile @ 30mph will take 1 minute
ARE 30 SECONDS WORTH IT?

Speed limit within our neighborhood is <u>25 MPH at all times</u> in the subdivision. Steps are being taken to add additional speed limit signs in the neighborhood. We are also working with the Richmond County Sheriffs to have **patrols**, **radar and ticketing**. It is every driver's responsibility to make sure that they are at or under 25 mph. An accident can happen *too* fast. Don't spend the rest of your life regretting that you "didn't see 'em". Let's make our neighborhood safe for all of us – especially our children.
