Take it to the curb!

At 9am on Saturday, January 21st we will be having a neighborhood clean up day. We invite everyone to meet us at the Esquer Park. The clean up destination will be announced the day of, and lunch will follow at noon.

Brush & Bulky scheduled for Monday, January 23, 2006

What is acceptable:

- Brush, tree trunks, branches and other green waste, up to 5 feet long and 24 inches diameter
- Lumber (up to 5 feet long and stacked in a separate pile no remodel materials or old fence)
- PVC and metal pipes (up to 5 feet long)
- Railroad ties (limit 5)
- Furniture, carpet, and doors
- Lawn mowers with fuel tank and crank case removed
- Scrap metal (bicycles, swing sets, etc., broken into 5 foot lengths)
- Cacti (must be boxed up to 25 lbs. per box)
- Appliances (remove freezer/refrigerator doors)
- Car tires (limit of five automobile tires)
- Metal drums (empty and cut in half)

What is NOT acceptable:

- Any excess over the 10 cubic-yard limit
- Any items other than those listed above, such as
 - o Stone/bricks/concrete/aggregates
 - o Flooring/roofing/insulation/sheetrock
 - Construction debris

- Wire fencing
- o Hazardous waste like paint/oil/pesticides/solvents/liquids
- o Glass/mirrors
- o Television and computer monitors
- o Compressed gas/air cylinder(s)
- Vehicle parts
- o Commercially generated material
